1. When Should I Keep My Sick Child Home from School (Vancouver Costal Health)

- a. Things to consider if your child feels unwell:
 - i. The wellbeing of your child. Without proper rest, a child may have a hard time fighting an illness or be at risk for other illnesses.
 - ii. The ability of your child to actively take part and learn at school.
 - iii. The school staff cannot care for a sick child and give them the support that they may need.
 - iv. The protection of other children.

 - i. Have a fever.
 - ii. Are too sick to take part in all normal school activities.
 - iii. Have a suspected or known communicable disease (i.e. strep throat, chicken pox. measles)
 - iv. Is vomiting or has diarrhea. It is recommended that students be symptom free at least 24 hours before returning to school.

c. Project spend is presently \$17,605

- 10k still needed to raise is this feasible?
- Mural and home reading material are not currently on the fundraising wishlist
- DK: something to consider for next year: increase in class fund can we go up from \$10 to \$15?
- Discussion around prioritizing budget
- Arts program support amounting \$6,700 isn't happening we can take that down to \$700;
 don't have arts program planned, have 2 performances but might want to keep contingency for future planning. Don't have matching for artist residency this year.
- Mural: DK indicated it would be ~\$6,000 to paint mural; waiting for district to send painter to at least cover the mural and then would like to engage artist to repaint
- Luisa suggested working towards the \$6,000 amount incrementally and see in Jan/Feb where we are with fundraising to contribute in increments.
- DK will send more items for wishlist to Ariella
- Swimming instruction at Templeton Pool for grade 5 students ~\$800 it's in the spring, so we have some time
- Home reading \$3,000 for primary grades to support in classroom reading content
 - Motion put forward by Luisa
 - Seconded by Damon

- Used to be allocated money for child minding or childcare options; grade 7s volunteered; would need babysitting training

- Idea raised by Cheryl
- · Cheryl has first aid certification

b. After school care

- Damon raised the issue of a lack of programs
- Long waiting list at the Y; does the PAC have any ability to help organize alternatives?
- Ariella: Y doesn't allow for part time enrollment; administratively burdensome; can do mornings or afternoons but can't split days of week. Can advocate for flexibility to open up more spaces.
- Jaye: Possible to have a second option run out of the school gym?
- Damen: Could be programs like pickleball
- Jaye: Ask local Ju Jitsu places on a rotational basis
- Ariella: Grace Barra does after school pick up
- Dan: any group that comes in has to go through VSB rentals, would be a cost there. Gets
 complicated when programs run in the gym because someone has to oversee them. Someone
 has to take that on. After school program has to mesh with school sports program, like
 volleyball which varies year to year.
