- Look forward to figuring things out and thinking.
- See that Math should be engaging, creative, and about making sense of the world.
- Incorporating the First Peoples Principals of Learning in all curricular areas, with special attention to how it lends itself to math instruction.

Goal 2: Continue our reconciliation journey with First nations, Metis, and Inuit by:
i. Increasing knowledge, awareness, appreciation of, and respect for Indigenous histories, traditions, cultures, and contributions.
ii. Aligning its policies and practices in a manner consistent with the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and the calls to action of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

## 3. Treasurer's Report

a. At the end of last year leading into AGM, Treasurer drafted a proposed budget, voted on and approved; available in the Treasurer and Finance folder on Dropbox. There are 3 accounts:

1. General account: Most activity funneled through that; $\$ 9 \mathrm{~K}$ in that account; projecting 10 K increase for 19 K by end of year. We should plan to leave 5 K minimum for next year's PAC.
2. Gaming account: via BC lotto; based on enrollment; expecting 4 K and right now 1,400 in the account; should leave a little surplus at end of year; some stipulations on what that we can spend that on
3. Funds that went through VSB - via school cash online: We don't see the funds, we just know that they have been raised by the PAC; keep an eye on those based on the separate tab in spreadsheet.

- DK: The funds are processed by VSB and shows up in our account; we do not touch that unless we talk to PAC. PAC makes decisions on how it is spent. We get a balance every month. We can find out if we can pull it out in a cheque for the PAC general account.
- AE: There is 1600 in the account currently minus the garden beds, expecting 4 k to come in via direct drive
- AE: Direct drive question: request went out for PAC but via school cash online to get a tax receipt. Direct drive feels like school fundraiser rather than PAC fundraiser.
- DK: Board issues tax receipt, we don't have a charitable number.
b. Any update on PNE funds?
- LR: Marta is waiting on cheque in the mail, we've been instructed to wait until the end of this week, if not Marta will contact. Would guess that it may take another month.
c. AE: Former treasurer tried to change account information with bottle refund. It's going now to the school, unclear if it's a PAC initiative or a school initiative.
- DK: should be PAC driven.
