Kindergarten Registration Opens tomorrow for Children Born in 2021

Kindergarten registration for the 2025–2026 school year is open for children born in 2021. All applicants must register with their English catchment elementary school—even if they plan to apply for a Choice Program.

Families interested in Choice Programs (Early French Immersion, Montessori, Indigenous Focus School, Early Mandarin Bilingual, Nootka Fine Arts) can apply during the Choice Program and Cross Boundary window, which runs from **January 6 to February 3, 2026**.

The **priority registration period** for kindergarten begins on **November 1, 2025**, and closes at **4 p.m. on January 31, 2026**. In-catchment students who register during this window will be given priority placement at Thunderbird Elementary before late applicants. **CLICK HERE FOR INFO AND REGISTRATION**

Keep Halloween Fun and Safe for Everyone

Today is Halloween! It is a time for spooky thrills and imagination—but it also brings extra risks for children and teens. Did you know that child pedestrian injuries are more likely on Halloween than on any other night of the year? Help keep the holiday safe and enjoyable with these essential tips:

- Check with your town or park district for earlier Halloween activities. Research shows that 6–9 p.m. is the riskiest time for child pedestrians.
- Plan ahead for older kids who are trick-or-treating alone. Review their route, agree on a return time, and make sure everyone has a working flashlight.
- Talk about distracted walking. Remind kids to avoid texting, using phones, or listening to music while walking.
- Cross streets safely and together. Most child pedestrian fatalities happen mid-block, not at intersections. Teach kids to use crosswalks and never cross between parked cars or out of driveways.
- Don't assume drivers will stop. Motorists may not see trick-or-treaters clearly, even if they have the right of
 way.
- Stick to well-lit streets and sidewalks. If there's no sidewalk, walk facing traffic at the edge of the road. Visit only homes with porch lights on and a clear, lit path.
- Remember: Halloween is about fun—injuries are never fun.

Rain or Shine: Be Ready for Fall and Winter Weather

As the fall and winter seasons settle in and rainy days become more frequent, please help your child stay comfortable and prepared:

- In Dress for the weather—warm layers, waterproof jackets, and boots make a big difference.

• Dack an extra set of clothes in your child's backpack for life's little accidents.

Students will be outside during recess and lunch **rain or shine**, so being weather-ready helps keep the day fun and stress-free.
