

 of preference in case your first-choice electives are unavailable or will not fit into your timetable.




Photography 10-12

For grade 9 photography please select Photo 10.

This course works as an introductory course in working as a photographer using school equipment. Students are given a Adobe Creative Cloud license for the semester as well. Camera basics and techniques are taught along with Photoshop editing.

This is a mixed grade level course; students will be enrolled grades 9 through 12.

Drama and Theatre

Drama 9-12 Develop your voice and movement skills to create dramatic works!

Students will participate in a variety of drama games, scene work and improvisation to improve their storytelling skills.

Computer Studies

Information and Communication Technologies 9

This introductory course develops foundational skills in game design, web development, UX design, and data science through hands-on projects using block coding and a basic introduction to HTML, CSS, and Python, while emphasizing ethical considerations in technology.

Computer Studies 10

Students will advance their programming skills in game design, web development, UX design, and data science by building on HTML, CSS, and Python, and introducing JavaScript, to create interactive web content and applications, applying an iterative design process and exploring the broader impact of technology.



TEXTILES 9 - 12

This course allows students the opportunities to learn and develop basic and advanced sewing skills. Students will select projects according to their sewing ability and individual preferences.
