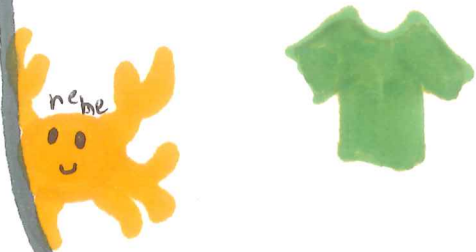

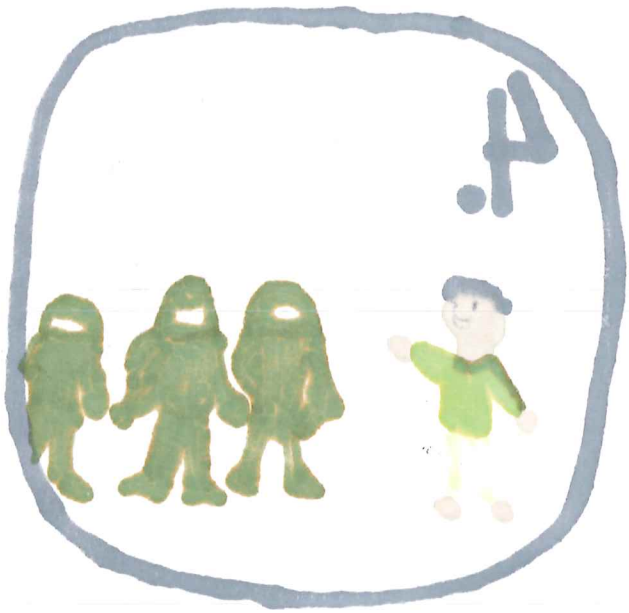

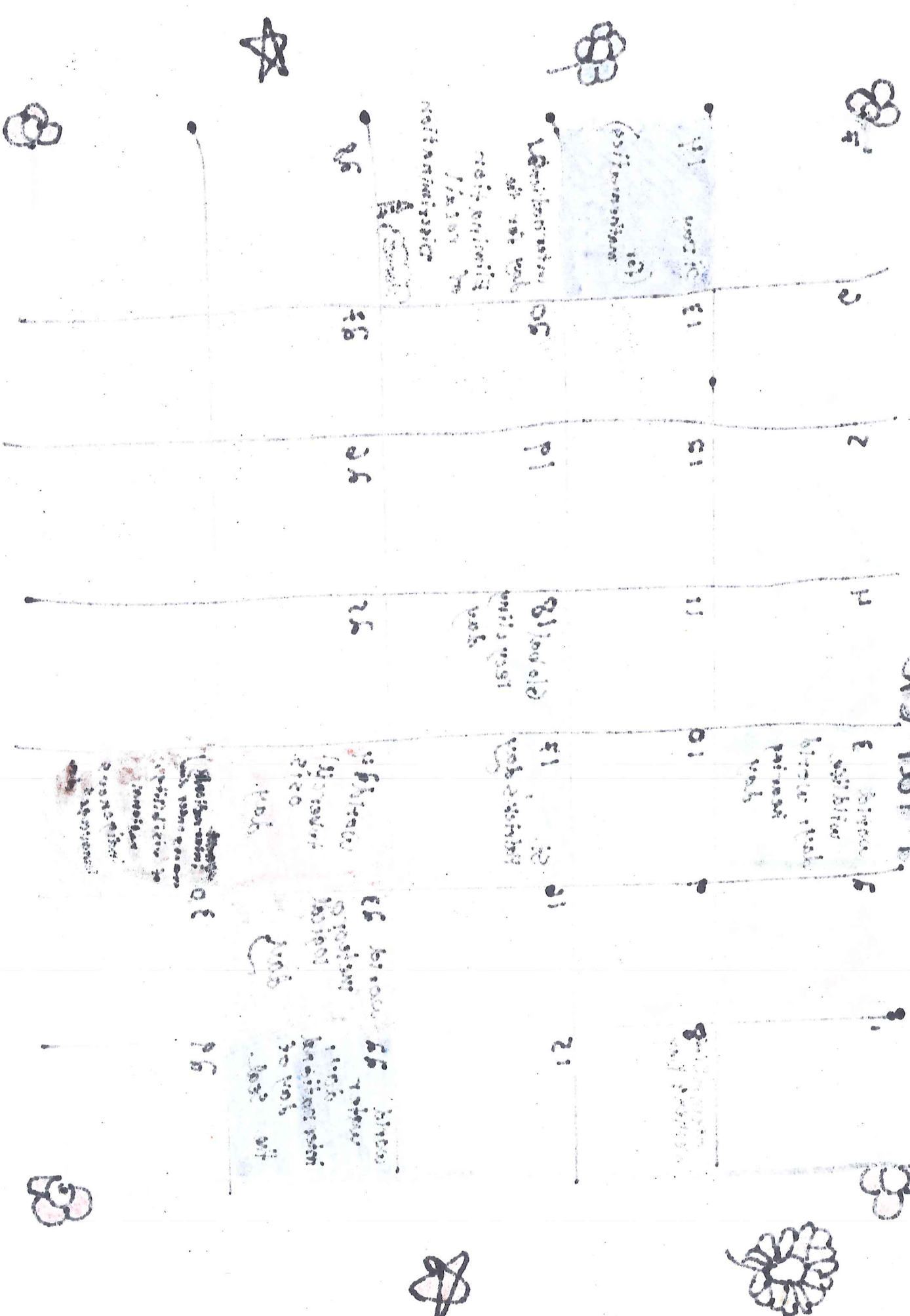

# RECIPE: OATMEAL COOKIES

## Ingredients:

1 cup all-purpose flour  
½ teaspoon baking soda  
¼ teaspoon baking powder  
½ teaspoon fine sea salt  
½ teaspoon ground cinnamon  
½ cup salted butter (softened)  
½ cup granulated sugar  
½ cup light brown sugar (packed)  
1 egg  
1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract  
1 ½ cup old-fashioned oatmeal

## Steps:

- 1) Preheat your oven to 375 degrees Fahrenheit. (190 degrees Celsius)
- 2) Line two large baking sheets with silicone baking mats or parchment paper. Set aside.
- 3) Combine the flour, baking soda, baking powder, salt and cinnamon in a small bowl. Set aside.
- 4) Put softened butter, granulated sugar and brown sugar in the bowl of a standing mixer and beat for 1 minute, or until light and fluffy.
- 5) Add egg and vanilla and beat on medium-high speed for 1 minute.
- 6) Add the dry ingredient mixture and beat on medium speed until combined.
- 7) Then, beat in the oatmeal on low speed.
- 8) If desired, beat in mix ins until evenly distributed in the dough.
- 9) Use a 1 ½ to 2 Tablespoon cookie scoop to measure out portions of dough.
- 10) Roll the dough into balls and place evenly spaced on the prepared cookie sheet – about 1 ½ inches apart.
- 11) Gently press down the tops of the oatmeal cookies until they are slightly flattened.
- 12) Bake in preheated oven for 8-10 minutes until the top is just set and the edges are lightly browned.
- 13) Let the oatmeal cookies sit on the baking pan for 5 minutes before transferring to a wire rack to cool.

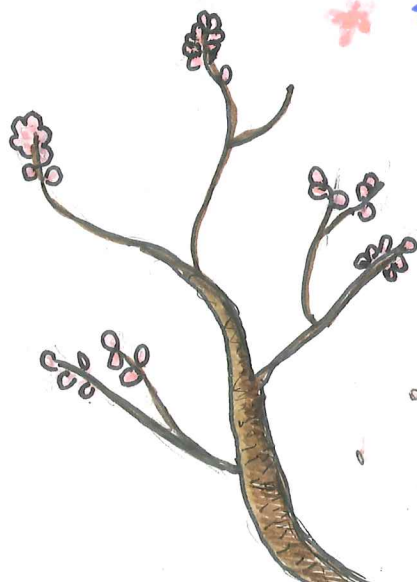

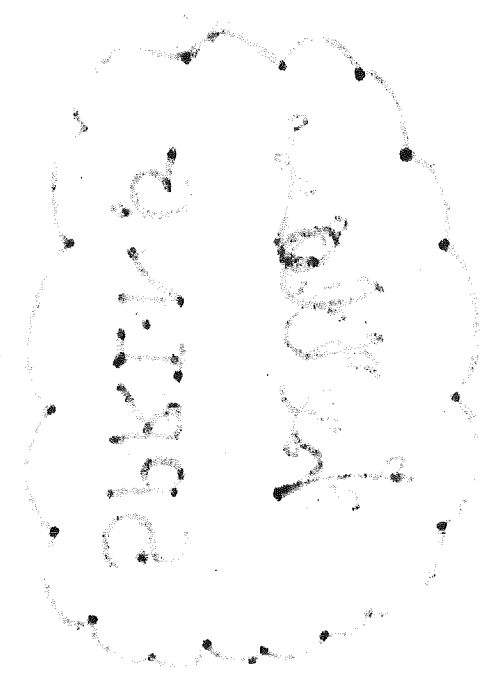

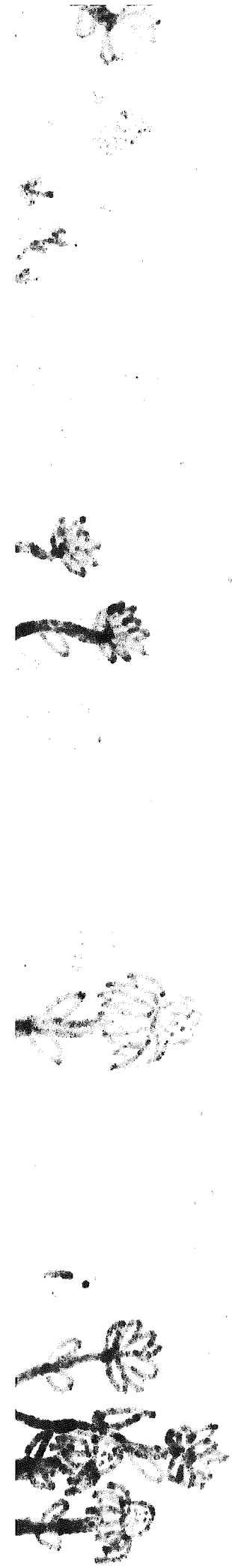
