Principal's Message

Dear Student and Families,

This week, we celebrated VSB's Support Staff Appreciation Day! It takes a team to nurture a caring community, and we appreciate our wonderful education assistants, multicultural workers, youth workers, settlement workers, Indigenous Education Enhancement workers, office staff, and engineering and custodial team for the amazing work they do every day connecting with our student and families as well as supporting the day-to-day running of our school. It is with sincere gratitude that we thank all our support staff.

On Thursday, November 13th, students will meet with homeroom classes during Flexible Instructional Time (FIT) to self-reflect on their thinking, communicating, personal and social core competencies and to set goals for future learning and growth. The <u>Core Competencies</u> are integrated throughout all areas of learning in the British Columbia K-12 curriculum, and students engage in core competency self-reflection and goal setting, building on their learning and growth each year. Students will upload their core competency reflection to the <u>SpacesEdu Digital Portfolio</u> platform. Please watch for an email from VSB by the end of November with a link to your child's digital core competency portfolio so that you can review with your child at home. Students will continue to add to their core competency reflections and goals throughout the year with homeroom classes during FIT in April and June.

Ordering Transcripts

Many post-secondary institutions request transcripts as an XML data transfer copy of your current official transcript. When grade 12 students send transcripts, it is important to select: "send updates" for one year to allow post-secondary institutions view their updated transcripts throughout the year.

StudentTranscripts Service

Information For Students

StudentTranscripts Service (STS) is an online application where students can view their school marks and scholarships. Students can also view and send their B.C. or Yukon transcript to Post-Secondary Institutions (PSI), employers, and/or designated Third Parties and order their B.C. graduation certificate.



- Step 1 Go to the StudentTranscripts Service (STS): www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca
- Step 2 Sign up for a Basic BCeID

To use the STS, you need to sign up for a Basic BCeID

- Complete the fields to register for a Basic BCeID
- Select your password reset questions and answers
- Step 3 Register for the StudentTranscripts Service (STS)

When registering for the STS using your Basic BCeID, you will be prompted to:

- Enter your student information (see Get Started information above)
- An email will be sent to the email address provided and must be activated within 24 hours of receipt or you will need to complete your STS registration again
- Once activated, you will be able to log onto the STS using your Basic BCeID and password
- Step 4 Log in to the StudentTranscripts Service (STS)

From your STS Student Dashboard, you can choose your Post-Secondary Institution (PSI) selections, preview, send and order transcripts/certificates, view exam and assessment results and view scholarship information. Please note that all transcripts previewed on the STS are considered unofficial, but official transcripts are sent once ordered.

You will need to consent to the STS privacy notice which enables the Ministry of Education and Child Care to send your transcripts to your selected PSIs by paper or XML data transfer depending on how the PSI receives transcripts. Printed copies of transcripts may take up to three weeks for processing and delivery to your recipients.




