



We would like to congratulate Gabriel Dalton for being the youth recipient of the Impact in Innovation award. He was recognized by Mayor Sim and the City of Vancouver for his work in digital sustainability. He received the award as well as an official proclamation signed by Mayor Ken Sim recognizing the growing importance of sustainable digital practices and is connected to the "Sustainable Technology Week". It officially establishes Sustainable Technology Week (October 20 - 27, 2025) to encourage residents, schools, and organizations to reduce their digital footprint, promote responsible technology use, and empower youth leadership in building a greener, more resilient future.

In summary, it explains that while digital technology plays a major role in education, business, and daily life, its environmental impact is often overlooked. It highlights how low-carbon web design, efficient hosting, and mindful device use can reduce emissions. The proclamation credits Oasis of Change Inc., the youth-founded, non-for-profit led by Gabriel Dalton, for planting more than 9,000 trees worldwide and preventing over 7,000 plastic bottles from entering the ocean.

Dragon's Groundwork Program is off to a ROARing start.

We're excited to share that 41 students have signed up to participate in our *Dragon's Groundwork* program, held Wednesday mornings during FIT. This initiative is a partnership with our SLO, the VPD and community coaches designed to help students strengthen their core competency skills in **Personal Awareness** and **Social Responsibility**—key areas that support both personal growth and community wellbeing.

Through engaging instruction in ground-based martial arts, students learn the fundamentals of self-defence while exploring the important connections between personal actions and social impact. The program fosters confidence, resilience, and a deeper understanding of how individual choices contribute to a respectful and safe community.

We're proud of our students for taking this step toward personal development and look forward to seeing their growth throughout the year.


