- Lindsay Hood volunteers for co-Treasurer
- Co-chair is still vacant
- Halloween parade does PAC want/need to be involved? Brad mentions it happens during school hours so not much opportunity for PAC involvement.

## **Fundraising**

- Ruby discusses winter fundraising ideas.
- Ruby mentions AstroFoods from last year, many outside school sales, not a huge money-maker, but not a failure. Photo fundraiser wasn't hugely successful.
- Ruby brings up the idea of direct cash donations on the school website.
  - o Brad, Laurie, Blake, Ruby discuss details and merits of asking for donations.
  - o Chad mentions idea to ask for cash donations in person. M. Gill says this is the likely the most effective option.
  - o Emily: Why not tell them they're donating to grade 7 grad, Spring Festival, classroom funds?
  - Chad mentions potential need for sandwich boards, Laurie mentions QR code to ask for donations.
  - M. Gill mentions the idea to check with the community centre to see if they have an extra board.
  - o Brad mentions it doesn't have to be just about fundraising it could mention upcoming events.
- M. Gill mentions there is an opportunity to sell food but it would require volunteers.
  - o Brad mentions we need to try to adhere to healthy food standards
  - o Emily is uncomfortable with selling additional sugar treats during school hours, also concerned about equity due to cost
- Question about gaming licence re 50/50 and auctions.
  - o Lindsay clarifies gaming money may need to be used for particular purposes with particular guidelines.
- Are we doing Indigo love of reading? Brad mentions we haven't applied in recent years, may talk to Ms.
   Ting about it.
- Laurie asks if we do any coffee mornings. Brad mentions we started Books for Breakfast and it basically
  combined with and subsumed the coffee morning initiative. Renfrew Starbucks donates coffee to these
  events.
  - o Chad mentions he may talk to Trees Organic which opened up in the neighbourhood recently.
  - o Brad mentions we never go over 2 travellers in terms of coffee consumption.
  - Laurie says the coffee initiative may be important for community building.
  - o Brad says Superstore may be a good lead. Still need 2 coffee containers.
- M. Gill mentions she may look into Walmart adopt a school for funding.
- Lindsay mentions that the PAC used to do bake sales and Krispy Kreme before COVID.
- Laurie asks about sending a multiple choice survey to parents but multiple people mention that we would be very unlikely
