Snack – A recess snack is required every day. Please ensure that you send a healthy, nutritious snack, such as a fruit, vegetable, cheese and crackers, small sandwich, or yogurt with your child. Please also pack a water bottle for your child. A healthy snack keeps your child learning and engaged at school.

Hot Lunch – Information about our hot lunch program will be coming home with your child the first week.

Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

Returning Students will follow the same entry and exit routines as last year. Parents and guardians are kindly asked not to line up with their children. Instead, children may wait with their families in the school yard until their teacher welcomes them in their designated line.

New students will come to the office on their first day and learn about their class line up spot after their first day. Parents of new students can pick up their child at the office after their first day of school and then show their family where their new line up spot is.

Visiting Parents/Guardians: Please note that school access for parents and guardians is by appointment only. To ensure student safety, all non-staff adults must enter through the main office on Cassiar Street and sign in at reception please.

Hot Meals for Students

Our hot lunch and breakfast programs start on Thursday, September 10.

- **Lunch:** \$6.95/day (subsidies available).
 - **Wed. Sep.9 Lunch Enrollment forms** and menus will be sent home.
- **Breakfast:** Free for all students, starts at 8:15am. Please enter the lunchroom from the primary undercover area on the Southwest side of the school

Dressing for the weather

Students will be outside during recess and lunch **everyday even when there is rain and snow.** Please dress children appropriately and consider sending an umbrella/raincoat and an extra set of clothes. If you need support with finding warm outdoor clothing, please let school staff know and we will try our best to support you.



Class organization, important information for families:

What is a combined class?

A combined class includes students from two or more grades who learn together in one classroom. Combined classes are common in elementary schools across the province and are supported by British Columbia's flexible curriculum.

In all classrooms, teachers plan for the students they teach. They provide learning activities and support that match each student's grade level and learning needs.

How school teams organize classes

Each year, schools receive staff based on the number of students enrolled. School teams then organize classes to support student learning. Schools must follow provincial rules and staffing agreements when creating classes. This means some students may be placed in combined classes.

How students are placed in classes

School teams consider many factors when organizing students into classes. Their goal is to create learning environments that support learning, positive relationships and student success. No single factor determines placement. School teams consider each student's individual circumstances, including:

- learning and support needs
- social-emotional development and peer relationships
- group dynamics and classroom balance

Teaching and learning in every classroom

In every classroom, students bring a range of strengths, interests, experiences and learning needs. Teachers plan learning experiences that support and challenge each learner.

Students may learn on their own, in small groups or with the whole class. Teachers use different ways to teach. They adjust activities and support based on what their students need.

Teachers use this approach in both combined and single-grade classes, following the curriculum for each grade while responding to each student's learning needs.

How can I support my child?

Families support their children's learning in many ways. Combined classes do not change the important partnership between home and school.

Families may wish to:

- talk with their child about what they are learning
- stay connected with their child's teacher and school
- attend school events and conferences
- reach out to school staff with questions or concerns
