

The Learn and Earn Program offers Indigenous high school students in grades 10-12 the opportunity to explore university life through a three-week, land-based summer program grounded in Indigenous knowledge, environmental stewardship, and culturally-responsive practice.

A partnership between the UBC Faculty of Education, UBC Faculty of Forestry and the Vancouver School Board - Indigenous Education Department, this program supports students in earning dual credit toward both high school and postsecondary coursework. Students will receive a scholarship for their participation and completion of the program.

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Program Highlights

Dual Credit Coursework

Students will complete two dual credit courses: Intro to Indigenous Studies (EDUC 140) and English First Peoples 11/12 Intro to Natural Resource Stewardship and Environmental Science 11

Funding
