



Career Development

Policy - Career Development and Work Experience

Career development is one of the goals of the public education system, shared by schools, family, and community. As stated in the Career Development Policy, education programs in B.C. schools should prepare students to successfully transition to post-secondary education or the world of work.

Opportunities to explore and research a multitude of education and career pathways allow students to develop the knowledge and the personal and social competencies to manage their career and life transitions.

Policy - Career-Life Connections

Required Courses and Training

As outlined in the Career-Life Connections policy, all students are expected to meet the career development learning standards in their Career-Life Education (CLE) and Career-Life Connections (CLC) courses and to complete 30 hours or more of career-life exploration before they graduate. When students complete secondary school, they should have developed the following:

- · Competencies to be self-directed, responsible individuals who can set and meet career goals.
- . Knowledge of a range of career choices, and actions needed to pursue those choices.
- . Employability skills required to work effectively and collaboratively in a workplace.



StudentTranscripts Service (STS) is an online application for students to view their school marks, transcripts,



scholarships and send transcripts electronically to post secondary institutions and employers.

Step 2 You must sign up for a BCeID before you can use the StudentTranscripts Service.

Step 1 Go to the Ministry of Education's Transcripts and Certificate website at

For BCeID signup, you need to:

- Sign Up for a BCeID - Complete the fields to register for a basic BCeID
- Select your password reset questions and answers (remember these as you will need them if you forget your password)
- Follow the system prompts and sign up for StudentTranscripts Service.
- Step 3 Log-in to StudentTranscripts Service using your BCelD.

When registering for the Student Transcript Service using your BCeID, you will be prompted to:

- Enter your student information used by your school (see Get Started information above)
- Read the personal data collection info and complete the process by clicking "submit"
- An email will be sent to the email address provided and must be activated within
- 24 hours of receipt or you will need to complete the registration process again
- Once activated, you will be able to log onto STS using your BCeID and password.


Step 4 From your STS Dashboard, you can choose your post-secondary institutions (PSIs) selections, preview, send and order transcripts, view exam and assessment results and view scholarship information. Please note that all transcripts previewed in the STS are considered unofficial, but official transcripts will be sent out when ordered.

> You will need to consent to the STS privacy notice which enables the ministry to send your transcripts to your selected PSIs by paper or electronically depending on how the PSI is able to receive transcripts. Printed copies of transcripts may take up to 3 weeks for processing and delivery to your selected PSIs.

Making an application is a process that is completed in STEPS over a period of time

Step 1 – Create a profile ie: let the universities know who you are (name, email, citizenship, choice of degree program (s))

Step 2 – Pay admission fee

Step 3 – Academic profile ie: transcipts via Student Transcripts Service and Self-Reporting grades (for some uni's)

Step 4 – Complete any Broad-Based Applications ie: Personal Profile (UBC) Personal Statement of Experience (Queen's) Admissions Information Form (Waterloo) Portfolio (Emily Carr) Etc.

 - Ontario Schools (OUAC)
- US (Common App) for many institutions

General Admission Requirements

Proof of English Language Proficiency

Canadian Universities typically look at grade 11 and 12 academic coursework pertaining to the program

Grade 12 marks take precedence over the Grade 11 mark in the same subject area (e.g. Precalculus 12 – 88%; Precalculus 11 – 75%)

However, given the semester system and that most application deadlines are in January of the Grade 12 year, universities will look at a Grade 11 mark in absence of a Grade 12 mark in the same subject area E




