Semester 2 Interim Reports will be published online in MyEd on Friday, March 8th at 2 pm. This interim will only include a strength-based comment. Grades and proficiency scales will be reported on the mid-semester report in April.

How to access your student's Report Card on the MyEd BC Family Portal

Interim Reports can be found on the MyEd BC Family Portal. Please follow the instructions below:

- 1. Go to the MyEd Website (https://www.myeducation.gov.bc.ca/aspen/logon.do)
- 2. Type in your student's student number for the login.
- 3. Your password is the one that you and your student have already been using.
- 4. You will find your child's report under "Published Reports" on the right-hand side.
- 5. <u>Please note reports are deleted when new reports are generated</u>. You may wish to save a copy for your records.

What if I forgot my password?

- 1. Click on the "I forgot my password" link.
- 2. A response should come to the email that is associated with the account.
- 3. If you do not recall the email associated with the account, please send an email to churchill@vsb.bc.ca to request assistance for a password reset.

What if my account is disabled?

FIT and MY WEEKLY PLANNER

Huge thanks to all members of our Churchill community for supporting our students as they make their Flexible Instruction Time choices. Over the past 2 weeks as we have begun providing families with attendance data, we have noticed:

- A 50 % increase in students creating FIT plans and attending on time.
- More interest from students in classroom use (connected with a teacher), as opposed to open study in the cafeteria.
- Increased questions from students on the best way to use their FIT time.

All of these positive trends have come through your help. As of March 1 though, we will need to temporarily pause attendance notifications as we navigate to a new communication system at the school.

When we resume:

- Students will continue to use the same sign up and attendance system (My Weekly Planner).
- Families will be notified by e-mail when their child does not sign up or does not attend FIT.

During this time, we would appreciate continued conversations on the best ways for your children to use Flexible Instruction Time, including which subjects require their attention the most, and which teachers they should visit on different days.

SCHOOL FEES

With the start of Semester 2 well underway, please take a moment to take care of any outstanding Semester 1 fees and current course fees. A note regarding workbooks – the fee for workbooks is a deposit and is refundable when your student returns the workbook, that hasn't been written in and is in near-new condition, to their classroom teacher. Parents and guardians unable to pay some or all of school fee are invited to speak to their child's teacher, school counsellor, and/or the school Principal.

STUDENT LEARNING SURVEY

The Student Learning Survey (SLS) has been administered every year in B.C. public schools since 2001. Prior to 2016-17 it was known as the Student Satisfaction Survey. The SLS provides feedback on the implementation of the curriculum changes, learning environment, student wellness and satisfaction, student belonging and engagement, and career preparation. The SLS is the only source of province-wide information about students' learning experiences through the perspectives of students, parents, guardians/caregivers, and school staff. Schools and districts use the SLS to make informed decisions around long-term planning and goal-setting, and in providing individual students personalized support. In 2021, the student survey underwent a review to accommodate an updated conceptual framework that align questions with the core competencies of the curriculum and the British Columbia's Policy for Student Success.

The Parent/Guardian/Caregiver survey is now available on-line at http://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey/access.htm where you will be asked to select your child's district (Vancouver 39), school's name (Sir Winston Churchill Secondary), and language of preference.

APRIL MINISTRY ASSESSMENTS

To accommodate all our grade 10s and minimize class disruption, Grade 10s will be scheduled into a morning or afternoon session for Numeracy 10 assessment in one of our computer labs on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>April 16th</u>. Regular classes for Grade 10s will **not** be in session on this day. Please note students in ELL 1-3 will **not** be writing this exam.

- Students have 3 hours to write this exam. To familiarize oneself with the exam, students are encouraged to go to the Ministry of Education and Childcare Website to watch the videos about the exam and view practice assessments in the Numeracy Assessment section.
- On April 16th, students need to bring their student ID card and report to their scheduled exam location at 8:35 am for morning sessions or 12:10 pm for afternoon sessions. Cell phones and other devices (watches) that connect to the internet are not permitted. Calculators must adhere to the <u>Calculator Policy</u>

Grade 11s and 12s who still need to write this exam as part of their graduation requirement, will be scheduled to write in the library on either April 17 or 18.

Students are asked to view TEAMS for their exam location date, time, and location.
