### 1. VSB: After the Bell, podcast season 2 dropped last week!

Kicking off season 2 of <u>VSB</u>: <u>After the Bell</u>, we take a deep dive into VSB's first Literacy Framework – what literacy is, what the framework does and what it means for student learning. In our matter-of-themonth segment, we turn our attention to Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity (SOGI) in the wake of recent anti-SOGI protests and talk about why SOGI education is still important today. #### 2. School Emergency Procedures

Our school's emergency procedures align with the policies and guidelines established by the Vancouver Board of Education. We regularly review these procedures with both staff and students. Every school year, we conduct 2 Earthquake drills, 6 Fire drills, and 2 Lockdown Drills. Classroom Teachers consistently reinforce these procedures with students to ensure their safety in the event of an actual emergency.

This week, we will be conducting our first fire drill. During these drills, we organize our students and follow evacuation procedures, relocating to our designated assembly area, which is the gravel field, while also taking attendance.

Regular practice is crucial because it helps school staff, students, and emergency responders become well-acquainted with the procedures outlined in our emergency plan. This familiarity is essential as it ensures that both staff and students remain calm and confident, knowing exactly what to do in the event of a real emergency.
