STUDENT PROCESS

- 1. Student assemblies and parent presentation through MS Teams
- 2. Students should bring home planning form to research and discuss with family
- 3. Students will enter course choices into MyEd for next year between **February 3th** and **February 13th**
- 4. Hand in **Course Selection forms** to the LLC by **February 13th**
 - **AP applications are due February 18th**



CHOOSE CAREFULLY

- Your choices determine what courses are offered next year.
- We will make every effort to get you the classes you choose now.
- It is difficult to make changes later because often classes are full and we can't get you in.

COURSE CHANGE POLICIES

- Course change requests will be accepted from **Sept 5th to Sept 12th 2025**
- Students will be able to submit one paper request form, no emails next year.
- **Please note course changes are not guaranteed due to class conflicts, full classes, etc.**
- After September 12th 2025 – a letter from a parent and administrator approval **will be required**
- Permission to change a course after the deadline will only be considered in exceptional cases (i.e. medical). A letter from parents will be required.
- Course changes after the deadline may receive a “W” on report card

CAREER LIFE CONNECTIONS & CAPSTONE

CLC is a continuation of CLE 10 and looks at planning for life after high school. It is done through remote assignments **on MS Teams** with a teacher available to support the students.

The Capstone project is a passion project guided by a teacher and presented in the spring of Grade 12.

LANGUAGE CHALLENGE

- Available for: Mandarin 11/12, Korean 11/12, Japanese 11/12, French 11/12, Spanish 11/12, Farsi 11/12 and Punjabi 11/12
- If you are fluent in another language and do not have credit for the courses, you can write a challenge exam for each level, 11 and 12, you will get 4 credits for each exam passed and the mark will go on your transcript
- The exams are offered once a year in January or February (in Delta)
- Registration is in **October**.
- **Students must meet with their counsellor to determine eligibility**
- (Many Universities **will not** use language challenge 12 marks for admission calculations, but UBC & SFU do accept as meeting the second language requirement)

EXTERNAL CREDITS

- **Approved credits authorized by Ministry of Education (Ministry Approved Organizations)**
- Some examples include:
 - Languages (Grade 7+ in another country)
 - Music (RCM Grade 6 and above)
 - Dance exams
 - Speech & Drama exams
 - Sports: Athletics – Provincial Level Athletes
 - Youth Development: (Scouts, Guides)
 - Industrial Development: (Driver's Ed., Industrial First-aid)

AP (ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM)

- Passion/interest
- Challenge and rigour
- AP exams may provide 1st year university credits
- Policies differ at some universities
- AP is recommended for US and UK applicants
- AP may enhance supplementary and scholarship opportunities

AP COURSES FOR 2025/2026

- **AP Biology 12**
 - Pre-Requisite: Biology 11 Pre AP
- **AP Calculus AB 12**
 - Pre-Requisite or co-requisite: Pre-Calculus 12
- **AP Chemistry 12**
 - Pre-Requisite: Chemistry 11 Pre AP
- **AP Economics-Microeconomics 12**
 - Pre-Requisite: none, open to all in Gr 11 &12
- **AP European History 12**
 - Pre-requisite Socials 11 or 12
- **AP English Literature and Composition 12**
 - Pre-requisite: English 11 taken at UHill
- **AP Physics 1**
 - Pre-Requisite Course Required: Pre-Calculus 11 (or to be taken concurrently)
- **AP Physics 2**
 - Pre-Requisite Course Required: AP Physics 1
- **AP Statistics 12**
 - Pre-requisite: Pre-calculus 11 and cannot be taken concurrently with AP Calculus

AP GUIDELINES

- Students may take up to a **maximum of 4 AP courses** at UHill per year
- Students are automatically registered for the AP exam in September and are expected to pay for it even if you might not write it in the spring.
- There is no reason not to write the exam. The exam scores are not part of your course mark and are not reported on your BC transcript. Universities only see the exam score if you ask college board to send the score to them.
- **Students taking AP courses are expected to carry a full course load at UHill as it is an enrichment program for students looking for additional academic challenge.**



Selection Criteria For AP

Students must complete an application with an AP letter of intent for any AP course they are hoping to take.

Due by February 18th Students **MUST** have completed the necessary pre-requisite courses as indicated in the AP course description(s) in the course planning guide and must have these pre-requisites approved by the AP selection committee.

Students will be ranked and priority will be given to students who have achieved a minimum of 86% in the pre-requisite course(s) with no course mark below 60% and a minimum average of 86% in the best 6 of 7 **courses at U Hill**.

Students taking AP courses are expected to carry a full course load at UHill as it is an enrichment program for students looking for additional academic challenge.

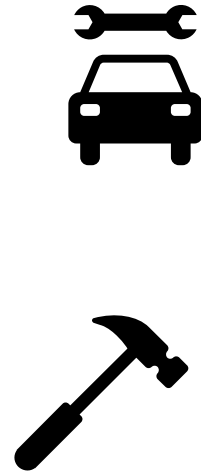

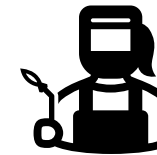

VOCABULARY

- **Admissions** – what you need to get in to the program

- **Direct entry** – can go in straight from high school
- **Document deadline** – the date when they want to see your marks and other data
- **Faculty/department** – the over-riding subject area to apply to
- **Major/minor/Honours** – subjects that you want to study
- **Transcripts** – the official record of your marks
- **Undergraduate/graduate** – you will be an **undergraduate**, graduate means you have graduated from university

Most Science programs and all Engineering programs require Chemistry and Physics 11 plus two Grade 12 sciences.

Sciences, Engineering, and Business programs all require Precalculus 11 and 12. Ontario Universities require Calculus 12 for these programs as well.

Arts/Humanities/Social Sciences and Fine Arts only require Precalculus 11 and one Science 11 course.

SUPPLEMENTAL APPLICATIONS & PERSONAL PROFILES

- **Be aware that Supplemental Applications and Personal Profiles may be required**
 - They are looking for School/Community/Extra-curricular Involvement
- Broad Based Applications –“whole” individual
 - Queens – PSE (Personal Statement of Experience)
 - Waterloo – AIF(Admission Information Form)
 - UBC - personal profile
- Specific Faculty/Program
 - Business (Supplementary profile/video interview)
 - Fine Arts (Portfolio, Audition)

- **Corpus Christi college**

- This college is on the UBC campus and students have access to the UBC facilities like the sports facilities and the libraries

US ADMISSIONS

- Overall average – grade 9 to 12
- SAT / ACT scores (some are “test optional” this year)
- Essays
- Letters of Recommendation
- Extra Curricular Involvement
- Common Application

- **Start EARLY** (now if you are in Grade 11!)
 - Be aware of deadlines
 - Give referees at least **three weeks** to write letters of recommendation

SUMMER SCHOOL NOTES

- It can be a good way to repeat a failed course or to bring up a mark.
- It **does not** give a good foundation for the next level course when trying to accelerate (it is too fast).
- **Tell your counsellor what your plans are and update us if your plans change!!!**
- We want to make sure we have room for you in the right course next year!
