Principal's Message

Dear Students and Families,

Thank you to our students who led and performed in our Remembrance Day Assemblies today. Our student MCs and poem readers spoke eloquently, and our choir and orchestra performed beautifully. It was a meaningful tribute, and we thank all students for participating in these important assemblies to honour our veterans. Lest we forget.

This week, we celebrated VSB's Support Staff Appreciation Day! It takes a team to nurture a caring community, and we appreciate our wonderful education assistants, multicultural workers, youth workers, settlement workers, Indigenous Education Enhancement workers, office staff, and engineering and custodial team for the amazing work they do every day connecting with our student and families as well as supporting the day-to-day running of our school. Daily Absences

Parents/guardians are to report all absences by email at <u>uhillswitchboard@vsb.bc.ca</u>. Emails should be sent using a parent/guardian email address and should provide the **student's first and last name**, **student number**, **grade**, **date(s) of absence**, **time of absence or periods of missed classes**, **and reason for the absence**. For extended absences parents/guardians must email the student's counsellor. A student should also email their teachers directly. It is the student's responsibility to make up any work that is missed, regardless of the reason for the absence. Exceptions to this may be granted due to unforeseen circumstances. If a student becomes ill while at school, or has an appointment during school time, students must sign out at the office. Students will only be released with parent permission. Students who are ill should not come to school and if they attend school and is deemed to be unwell, parents/guardians will be contacted to pick up their child.
