MyEducation BC Accounts – Summer Access

Reminder that all MyEd BC Student Family accounts will be suspended by August 8, 2025. There will be NO access to the published learning updates after August 8, 2025. This timeline is to accommodate students attending the summer learning program, allowing them to view/download their Learning Update upon courses completion. If you foresee the need to access your published Learning Update during the summer, we suggest printing a hard copy or saving a digital copy to a medium that you can access.

All Grade 12 Grads accounts will be disabled and locked after August 8, 2025.

All students' Accounts (returning and new) will be enabled for **September 1, 2025**. They will be accessible by their last successful login ID and password.

Notice of Late Return for September 2025

Please complete the <u>Notice of Late Return Form</u> for September 2025 if your student is expecting to return to school LATER THAN noon on **Friday, September 5, 2025**, <u>but prior to September 29, 2025</u>. Click on the "notice of late return link" or see the last page of this newsletter for the form. Please note: If the school cannot verify your child's attendance at school by **noon on Friday, September 5, 2025**, your child's space will be given to another student on the school's waitlist.

School Office Reminders

Reminder to all Grade 12 Students of two important dates:

- June 30 Last Day to access your MS Teams/Email/Office Account
- August 8 Last Day to access your MyEducation BC Account

Also, to ensure the safe delivery of your graduation certificates, we are going to be requesting that they are picked up **directly from** the school office at the end of the summer.

We will send a reminder email when the graduation certificates are available for pickup, which will be by the **end of August** or **early September** at the latest.

If you are unable to come to the school to pick up your graduation certificate, you have the following options:

- 1. Assign Someone to Pick It Up for You:
 - Please notify Ms. Wang by email in advance (cwang@vsb.bc.ca) with the name of the person who will be picking
 up the certificate on your behalf.
 - o The designated person must present their **ID** when they come to pick up the certificate.
- 2. Request Mailing Within Canada:
 - You can come to the school to write the mailing address on an envelope.
 - Please note that we cannot mail certificates outside of Canada

Absences

Parents/guardians are to report all absences by email at <u>uhillswitchboard@vsb.bc.ca</u>. Emails should be sent using a parent/guardian email address and should provide the following:

- · students first and name
- student number
- date(s) of absence
- time of absence/periods of missed classes
- and the reason for the absence

<u>For extended absences</u> parents/guardians must email the student's counsellor. A student should also email their teachers directly. It is the student's responsibility to make up any work that is missed, regardless of the reason for the absence. Exceptions to this may be granted due to unforeseen circumstances. If a student becomes ill while at school, or has an appointment during school time, students must sign out at the office. Students will only be released with parent/guardian permission. Students who are ill should not come to school, and if they attend school and are deemed to be unwell, parents/guardians will be contacted to pick up their child.

MyEducationBC Accounts

A reminder that MyEducationBC (MyEd) is the student information system for the Vancouver School Board. A Student/Family Portal Account has been created by the district for all students at University Hill Secondary School. This account is a shared account where students and parents can access student schedules, daily/class attendance, course grades and learning updates. It is imperative that you share the account information (password) as a family (with your child). Your login for this account is your child's student number. Please use the website to login: MyEducationBC Account and the instructions for set up of account: MyEd Student Family Portal. Click on the link to UHILL's Technology Guide if you require assistance. Please Do not use the BC Services Card option.

School Fees/School Cash Online

If you haven't already done so, please check and register for "School Cash Online" and pay for any items or outstanding or new school fees. If there are any discrepancies, please email Mrs. Low https://vsb.schoolcashonline.com/. This is the preferred method for paying for all items for school including: yearbooks, school fees, workbook fees, etc. This method is also a quicker way to receive a refund if one is required.
