INDIGENOUS GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

Effective the 2023/24 school year, all students working toward a B.C. Certificate of Graduation ("Dogwood Diploma"), in English or French, must successfully complete at least 4 credits in Indigenous-focused coursework. This requirement applies to students in B.C. public, independent, First Nations, and offshore schools. There is no change to the total number of credits required to graduate, which remains at 80. This change to the BC Graduation program represents an important next step towards lasting and meaningful reconciliation. The new

graduation requirement will provide all B.C. students with the necessary time and opportunity to develop a deeper understanding of the experiences, cultures, histories, and contemporary contexts of Indigenous peoples in Canada. Course options that satisfy this requirement will be discussed during course planning with Grades 10-12. We encourage families to review the "Information for Students and Parents" of the <u>Ministry of Education website.</u>

ACCESSING RESULTS

The November 2022 assessment session results are now available for the Grade 12 Literacy Assessment (LTE12).

To see and download a copy of your child's results for either the Gr10 or Gr12 Assessments -

- 1. Go to <u>www.studenttranscripts.gov.bc.ca</u> (don't be thrown by the info re transcripts, you are on the right page)
- 2. Click on Current Student
- 3. Then either Register for a Basic Account or Login if you already have one. You will need your child's information as noted on the page.
- 4. You will receive an email via the email you entered (should be child's). Click the link in the email to confirm.
- 5. You can then login and you will see Assessments and Results among other items in the Dashboard. You can view or download PDF.

REPORTING & STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT INFORMATION

If your child receives an Incomplete/In Progress Report (also known as an "I" Report) for any of their classes, it is crucial that they connect with their teacher(s) to develop a plan to complete the missed work. Please note, that all work must be submitted prior to the end of the semester to be assessed and evaluated for the semester 1 Final Report unless specified by the teacher. The end of the semester is the end of the course and teachers are unable to accept and assess work after the semester ends. If you have any questions about your child's progress, you are welcome to email the teacher or grade counsellor directly. Click <u>HERE</u> for our staff directory.

All students will be receiving a Final Semester 1 report on **Friday, February 10, 2023**. These reports will include a final mark, work habit, and comment for each Semester 1 class. Please note that your child's report card is **electronic** and will be published to their MyEducation BC account. Semester 1 final reports will be available until March 7th, 2023. **It is recommended that you download and save a**

copy for future reference. Detailed information on how to access this report will be sent to families closer to the reporting date.

TECH DAY

On January 25, 2023, we are planning our second "Tech Day" for the year. There will not be "regular classes", but opportunities for students to attend a variety of workshops, hear presentations, participate in grade wide activities and complete assessments and much more! January's theme is a Theme of Sustainability & Allyship. We thank the staff and students who have spent their time creating and leading sessions for this "real-world" day of learning. More details will be provided to families closer to the date. Note, we are pooling FIT time from January 17- February 2, which means during these weeks everyday will follow a MWF schedule or four-81 minutes periods each day with no FIT periods. TECH DAY is created based on Flexible Instruction Time (FIT) periods of instructional time. Next Tech Day will be Wednesday April 25, 2023 with a theme of "Mental and Physical Health".

FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL TIME (FIT)- REMINDER

What is FIT? Tuesdays and Thursdays, students are provided with 50 minutes of Flexible Instruction Time (FIT). FIT is intended for learning opportunities and student support. This will continue in Semester 2.

As a reminder to students:

- All students are expected to be in a school learning space with a teacher
- Students are expected to sign up for a teacher each week via: <u>http://vantech.myweeklyplanner.net</u> (attendance is taken)
- This is school time (instructional time) and students get a choice of how to spend it doing school work or student interest activities.
 For example, students may participate in weekly classes, collaborate with peers, see individual teachers.

STUDENT AND FAMILY AFFORDABILITY FUND

Student and Family Affordability Fund In late August the provincial government announced that new, one-time funding would be provided to BC school districts to help address some of the rising costs families currently face.
