Please note that your child's report card is **electronic** and will be published to their MyEducation BC account. Semester 1 final reports will be available until March 7th, 2023. *It is recommended that you download and save a copy for future reference*. COURSE PLANNING INFORMATION

Grade counsellors have been visiting classes that have not yet done course planning for next year to go over the process and provide answers to questions students might have. Parents can also be involved in the course planning process! We encourage you to discuss with students the various course options available to your child. The counselling department will complete course selection with Grade 8-11 students by February 28, 2023.

INDIGENOUS GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

Effective in the 2023/24 school year, all students working toward a B.C. Certificate of Graduation ("Dogwood Diploma") in English or French, must successfully complete at least 4 credits in Indigenous-focused coursework. This requirement applies to students in B.C. public, independent, First Nations, and offshore schools. There is no change to the total number of credits required to graduate, which remains at 80. This change to the BC Graduation program represents an important next step towards lasting and meaningful reconciliation. The new graduation requirement will provide all

B.C. students with the necessary time and opportunity to develop a deeper understanding of the experiences, cultures, histories, and contemporary contexts of Indigenous peoples in Canada. Course options that satisfy this requirement will be discussed during course planning with Grades 10-12. We encourage families to review the "Information for Students and Parents" on the <u>Ministry of Education</u> website.

GRADUATION ASSESSMENT RESULTS

On **January 25th**, **2023** (Tech Day) - Grade 10s completed the Numeracy 10 assessment and the Grade 12 Semester 1 FRAL 12 students completed the Évaluation de littératie de la 12e année. Results of these assessments will be posted in 8-10 weeks.

The results are now available for Grade 12 students who completed the Literacy Assessment (LTE12) in November 2022 assessment session,.

ACCESSING ASSESSMENT RESULTS

To see and download a copy of your child's results for either the Gr10 or Gr12 Assessments -

- 1. Go to <u>www.studenttranscripts.gov.bc.ca</u> (don't be thrown by the info re transcripts, you are on the right page)
- 2. Click on Current Student
- 3. Then either Register for a Basic Account or Login if you already have one. You will need your child's information as noted on the page.
- 4. You will receive an email via the email you entered (should be child's). Click the link in the email to confirm.
- 5. You can then login and you will see Assessments and Results among other items in the Dashboard. You can view or download PDF.

FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL TIME (FIT) - SEMESTER 2

What is FIT? On Tuesdays and Thursdays, students are provided with 50 minutes of Flexible Instruction Time (FIT). FIT is intended for learning opportunities and student support. This will continue in Semester 2. This is instructional time and students are encouraged to sign up with one of their teachers for support or take advantage of one of the connection activities being offered. We will be sending home attendance notifications through MyWeeklyPlanner for FIT time sessions for those students who miss a session or are not signed up.

As a reminder to students:

- All students are expected to be in a school learning space with a teacher
- Students are expected to sign up for a teacher each week via: http://vantech.myweeklyplanner.net (attendance is taken)
- This is school time (instructional time) and students get a choice of how to spend it doing school work or student interest/connection activities.
 For example, students may participate in weekly classes, collaborate with peers, see individual teachers, or pursue learning activities that may fall outside of their scheduled classes.
- Staff and supports will be available for students.

TECH DAY

As we are a learning community that has a goal of fostering lifelong learning, we are excited to report our second "Tech Day" on January 25th was a success! This day is to experience learning in a different way, beyond the 4 walls of the classroom. We remind families that these are instructional days in which students are expected to be in attendance.

January's theme was ALLYSHIP and SUSTAINABILITY- another theme which was voted on by the student body. Topics of workshops include sustainability and fashion, geopolitical issues, fresh water conservation, and more! There are also program and grade-wide activities. Student-led workshops and field studies happening during this day.

STUDENT AND FAMILY AFFORDABILITY FUND

The provincial government announced that new, one-time funding would be provided to BC school districts to help address some of the rising costs families currently face. Please let us know if your family would benefit from support by contacting your child's counsellor. All requests for support will be treated as private information and will only be shared with staff who need to know.

Extended Absences

Any students who will be away for an extended period (trave, medical etc.) should see their grad counsellor to complete an extended absence form.

Daily Health Checks

Although there are no formal protocols, we encourage all students and staff to complete a daily health check. If you feel unwell, stay at home. Parents and caregivers are responsible for assessing their children daily before sending them to school. School administrators will ensure staff and other adults know they are responsible for assessing themselves daily for symptoms prior to entering the school.

Student Pick-up/Drop-off

A kind reminder that traffic signs are in place along Penticton Street to allow space for school buses to drop-off and pick-up students. Thank you for being compliant with city bylaws. Please note that several drivers have been ticketed in the past. You can drop-off and pick-up students past the traffic signs further south along Penticton Street.
