September has flown by! Thank you to the entire school community - students, caregivers, and staff - for the smooth transition to another year of learning.



This fall, Van Tech students and staff continue to build a strong sense of belonging, by collaborating and learning together in a myriad of ways. On September 27, we held a ceremony to unveil artwork installed at the front entrance of the school created by artist Xwalacktun (Rick Harry), of the Squamish and Kwakwak'wakw nations. As a host family, Van Tech followed the local nations' protocols of witnessing and oral traditions of sharing with others what is being witnessed. Representatives from the Musqueam, Squamish and Tseil-Waututh nations and dignitaries from the school district were in attendance. Students and staff gathered in front of the school or watched a live

stream of the event from their learning space.

Grade assemblies were held to recognize the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on September 29. Students and staff honored Indigenous voices and reflected on our nation's history. Thank you to Gr. 12 MCs Nola, Sicily, and Vienna, Van Tech music students for their rendition of the Coast Salish Anthem, Van Tech Indigenous Support teacher Robin Roberts for sharing his family history and cultural teachings, and the amazing staff who planned the event. Van Tech's equity work is grounded in the First People's Principles of Learning, the 94 Calls to Action of the Truth & Reconciliation Commission of Canada, and the Vancouver School Board's Education Plan. Our school community continues to engage in conversations about how we as individuals and a collective can take part in Reconciliation.

Students have been keen to connect with their friends and make new ones as they engage in the many learning opportunities provided at school. As always, Van Tech offers extracurricular activities in athletics and student clubs.

## **REPORTING & STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT INFORMATION**

Students will receive an **electronic** Interim Learning Update published to their MyEducation BC account on October 13 and will be available online until November 23. Mid-Semester Learning Updates will be published on November 24. It is recommended that you download and save a copy for future reference. If your child receives an IE (Insufficient Evidence) for any of their classes, it is crucial that they connect with their teacher(s) to develop a plan to demonstrate their learning of the course material. Please note that all work must be submitted prior to the end of the semester to be assessed and evaluated for the semester 1 *Summary of Learning* unless specified by the teacher. The end of the semester is the end of the course and teachers are unable to accept and assess work after the semester ends. ## **GRADE 8 & 9 INFORMATION**

Career Education 8 and 9 are mandatory courses as prescribed by the Ministry of Education and Child Care. The courses will be delivered over MS TEAMS. Students will be given more information about their course and added to their grade Team soon, where they will be able to view course instructions and assignments. Most assignments focus on career exploration and being an educated citizen. There will be ample opportunities for students to work on these courses, including during FIT. We encourage families to remind their children about checking this TEAM.

## **GRADUATION ASSESSMENTS**

Graduation assessments are used to assess students' proficiency in numeracy and literacy. They are not associated with any course mark, but **their completion is part of the BC Graduation Requirements.** 

Gr. 12 students will write the Graduation Literacy Assessment on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>November 1</u>. Details of times and room numbers will be provided soon.

## **FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL TIME (FIT)**

What is FIT? FIT happens four days a week, for 40 minutes: Monday and Friday, 8:40 - 9:20 am, and Tuesday and Thursday, 1:20 - 2:00 pm.

- FIT is a period of instructional time built into the weekly schedule that gives our students more agency in their **learning**, **goal setting**, **and time management**, empowering student to develop their **thinking**, **communication**, **personal**, **and social core competencies**.
- Ultimately, the purpose of FIT is to support the **learning** and **well-being** of students by enabling them to have choice in how, when, and where their learning takes place. For example, students may collaborate with peers, see individual teachers, or pursue learning activities that fall outside of their scheduled classes.
- Staff will help students consider how to best utilize FIT throughout the school year.

Students sign up for **Tuesday and Thursday FIT** sessions using <a href="http://vantech.myweeklyplanner.net">http://vantech.myweeklyplanner.net</a> They are expected to be in the building in an area supervised by a staff member.

For **Monday and Friday FIT**, students in the building are expected to be engaged in a learning activity of their choice. Students do not need to sign up for these FIT days, but if they're in a teacher's learning space, they must sign-in to the Green Book for attendance in the case of an emergency.

#### **FIT Questions & Answers**

## Q1: Will my teachers be available during FIT?

**A:** Yes. Since FIT is instructional time, teachers are available to support you in your learning by offering extra help, engaging with you in an educational program, or by providing a place to study and collaborate.

### Q2: Can a teacher assign me to a specific class/task during FIT?

**A**: Yes. Since FIT is instructional time, a teacher may specify that you spend your FIT with them, especially if you are behind in your learning in that subject. If more than one teacher requires you to spend FIT with them, it is your responsibility to arrange a schedule and communicate with your teachers. Teachers can also, on occasion, have an entire class come in for flex to complete a lab, assignment, tutorial, exam, etc.

#### Q3: Can I go to the classes of teachers who I do not currently have?

**A:** Maybe. It is expected that you will be seeking help from your current teachers. Teachers may wish to help students that are not currently enrolled in their classes.

## Q4: What if a class I want to go to is full?

**A:** Classroom spaces may be capped at 30 students (or less depending on the learning space). If your FIT choice is full, make sure you have a second choice ready.

#### Q5: What if there is an assembly or core competency activity scheduled during FIT?

**A**: If there in an assembly or core competency activity scheduled during FIT, you are expected to attend and participate in the assembly or core competency activity.

#### Q6: What if there is a fire alarm or a need for an evacuation?

**A:** All students and staff respond as they would during regular class time: evacuate the building via the designated exit, and then **marshal on the grass field.** 

- Morning FIT: marshal with your Period 1 teacher after evacuation.
- Afternoon FIT: marshal with your Period 3 teacher after evacuation.
- Before school: marshal with your Period, 1 teacher, after evacuation.
- Break, lunch, or afterschool: marshal with the teacher from your previous Period after evacuation

Photo retakes will be held after lunch on October 4. **Any student who has not had their photo taken must do so on this day.** Students who would like a retake must bring their <u>Artona photo access card</u> &/or original GoCard to show the QR code to the photographer.

Photos from the first photo day are on the Artona website for viewing <u>HERE</u>. Use the QR code or the 16-digit code on the photo access card to access the photo. If you have lost your photo access card, click the "I lost my photo access card button." If anyone has any questions or needs assistance, the Artona online support team is available to live chat seven days a week.

Various employers and industry representatives will be there and will take your questions about apprenticeship, training, Women in Trades, and supports for youth pursuing a skilled trade.
