CHILDHOOD 2.0: A Documentary About Growing Up In The Digital Age

Join Templeton Secondary's PAC on Tues, April 15 in the Templeton Auditorium, 6:45 - 9:00pm.

## About the movie:

Childhood 2.0 is required viewing for anyone who wants to better understand the world their children are navigating as they grow up in the digital age. Featuring actual parents and kids as well as industry-leading experts in child safety and development, this documentary dives into the real-life issues facing kids today — including cyberbullying, online predators, suicidal ideation, and more.

This film is a reflection of the world we currently live in and a resource to be contemplated. The filmmakers have made every attempt to craft an honest picture of what childhood is today, kids spending more time online and less engaging in real life, free play, and autonomy. What are the effects on the next generation's mental, physical, and spiritual health? Childhood was more or less unchanged for millennia — this is Childhood 2.0.

Stay after the movie for a Q&A, hosted by Carol Todd, MSC, SD43 Educator and Founder of The Amanda Todd Legacy Society

Carol Todd has impacted the world as an educator, an advocate, a parent and a leader for social change in speaking openly about the bullying, cyberbullying, exploitation and the mental health challenges that her daughter Amanda went through. She has become a voice of global change and is driven by her passion and leadership to change the mindset behind negative behaviours and the challenging barriers of stigma by sharing Amanda's story. Empowering youth and adults with strategies and resources to address exploitation and sextortion has become a primary goal in Carol's advocacy. She was recently awarded the Meritorious Service Cross Medal of Canada by Governor General Mary Simon on behalf of King Charles III for her dedication in ensuring online safety and mental health wellness for all Canadians.

In 2012, Carol's daughter Amanda took her own life at the age of 15, following the posting of a YouTube video that detailed the sextortion and exploitation she endured via an international predator which then resulted in severe harassment that came from her peers (online and offline). From this place of tragedy, Carol has found that by sharing Amanda's story, she could help others.

## **Summer School**

If your child is assessed as Emerging (Gr 8 or 9 course) or Failing (Gr 10 or 11 course) in the Summary of Learning, a teacher may recommend they complete a Review course (Gr 8 and 9) or a Remedial course (Gr 10 and 11) in Summer School. Alternatively, the teacher may suggest enrolling your child in a Preview course, which provides an overview of a course they plan to take in the upcoming school year. For more information, please contact your child's grade counsellor. Click HERE for our staff directory.

Other Summer School courses include ELL courses that give newcomer students the opportunity to improve their listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills in a welcoming and supportive environment, and Completion courses are for Gr. 10-12 students who wish to repeat a course to improve their mark up to a maximum of 65%.

All courses are in-person. Review, Remedial, Preview, and ELL courses run from July 3 to July 25, 2025. Completion courses run from July 3 - August 1, 2025.

## **Student Learning Survey**

The Student Learning Survey provides feedback on the implementation of the curriculum changes, leaning environment, student wellness and satisfaction, student belonging and engagement, and career preparation. It is the only source of province-wide information about students' learning experiences though the perspectives of students, parents, caregivers, and school staff. Schools and school districts use the SLS to make informed decisions around long-term planning and goal setting and in providing student supports. The SLS for caregivers is available online at <a href="Student Learning Survey-Province of British Columbia">Student Learning Survey-Province of British Columbia</a> (awinfosys.com) in 18 different languages. The survey will be available until May 2. Please take 30 minutes to complete this anonymous survey.

# **Reporting Information and Updates**

The purpose of assessment is to facilitate learning and move it forward in an equitable and inclusive way. It helps students answer three questions about their learning:

- Where am I now?
- Where am I going?
- How do I get there?

Quality assessment is ongoing and responsive. It informs the instruction cycle and provides **teachers** with evidence to plan. It helps **families** understand and support their children's learning. Most importantly, it provides **students** with meaningful feedback to guide their learning and help them reflect on their growth.

## How will my child be assessed?

All students will receive **Written Learning Updates** and **Informal Learning Updates** such as telephone calls, e-mails, and conferences. Written Learning Updates will include self-reflection and goal setting, as well as descriptive feedback. The



Provincial Reporting Policy requires that students in Gr 8 and 9 receive grades on a four-point proficiency scale (*Emerging, Developing, Proficient, Extending*), while students in Gr 10 -12 courses receive a letter grade and percentage.

The grade "IE" (Insufficient Evidence) indicates that the student has not yet demonstrated minimally acceptable performance in relation to the learning standards. For students in Gr 10-12, an "IE" may be converted to an F (Fail) at the end of the course. Should your child receive an "IE" for any of their classes, the teacher will identify what learning standards (competencies and content knowledge) they need to demonstrate and create a support plan for the student. This plan will outline the actions to be taken by the student and school to help the student provide sufficient evidence of learning. Please reach out to your child's teacher(s) to discuss an Insufficient Evidence "IE" grade or any other concerns you may have about your child's progress. Click HERE for our staff directory.

### **Learning Updates**

All students received their Semester 2 Interim Learning Update on March 13, which includes comments for Semester 2 courses and final marks for Semester 1. Please note that your child's report card is **electronic** and will be published to their MyEducation BC account. It is recommended that you download and save a copy of your child's Interim Learning Update for future reference. It will not be available after April 23, 2025.

# Flexible Instructional Time (FIT)

FIT, Flexible Instructional Time, happens every day *except* Wednesday, for 40 minutes. During FIT students are expected to be engaged in a learning activity of their choice.

Monday and Friday FIT runs 8:40 - 9:20 am, and students do not need to sign up in advance, but when they are in the building, they should be in a learning space and sign in to the Green Book for attendance in the case of an emergency.

Tuesday and Thursday FIT runs 1:20 - 2:00 pm. Students must sign up for Tuesday and Thursday FIT sessions using <a href="http://vantech.myweeklyplanner.net">http://vantech.myweeklyplanner.net</a> They are expected to be in the building in an area supervised by a staff member.

- This is school (instructional) time, and students get a choice of how to spend it doing either schoolwork or personal interest activities.
- For example, students may participate in weekly classes, collaborate with peers, see individual teachers, or pursue learning activities that may fall outside of their scheduled classes.
- Staff and supports will be available for students.
- Teachers will communicate with students how to best utilize FIT in support of their academic success throughout the school year.

## **Graduation Assessment Schedule & Results**

As part of the graduation requirements, students are required to write three Graduation Assessments: Numeracy 10, Literacy 10, and Literacy 12. French Immersion students who wish to obtain a Diplôme de fin d'études secondaires en Colombie-Britannique must also write the French Immersion Literacy Assessment.

Note that these are NOT Provincial Exams. The result a student achieves on the assessment(s) will not impact their academic standing, BUT students are required to write the assessments to meet Graduation Requirements.

#### Results

To view and download your child's Graduation Assessment results, go to Student Transcripts Services, click on "Current Student," and register for a BCeID (or log in if you already have one). You will need your child's information as noted on the page. You will receive a confirmation email; click the link in the email to confirm. Once your account is created, click on "Graduation Assessment/Provincial Exam Results" to view the results. This site also allows you to "View Your Transcript," "Send/Order Your Transcript," and access other options. Note that the Ministry transcript includes only completed courses, not in-progress ones.

## **Student Learning Survey**

The Student Learning Survey provides feedback on the implementation of the curriculum changes, leaning environment, student wellness and satisfaction, student belonging and engagement, and career preparation. It is the only source of province-wide information about students' learning experiences though the perspectives of students, parents, caregivers, and school staff. Schools and school districts use the SLS to make informed decisions around long-term planning and goal setting and in providing student supports. The SLS for caregivers is available online at <a href="Student Learning Survey-Province of British Columbia">Student Learning Survey-Province of British Columbia</a> (awinfosys.com) in 18 different languages. The survey will be available until May 2. Please take 30 minutes to complete this anonymous survey.

## **General Procedures**

## Financial support is available for families.

The <u>Student Affordability Fund</u> provides financial from the Ministry of Education and Childcare for VSB families who are struggling to pay for costs associated with their child(ren) going to school. Caregivers can get financial help for: i. Basic school supplies (e.g. pens, paper) ii. Education-related fees (e.g. additional supplies for ADST, culinary and art classes, workbooks, camps, field trips, relevant cultural events, clubs, and instrument and equipment fees or other fees charged by school districts) iii. Clothing/footwear required for school sports and other school activities. If you would like financial support, please contact our Principal, Mr. Moro, or your child's grade counsellor.

## Student Fees

To pay school or course fee, create an account using <u>School Cash Online</u>. The school fee schedule (an itemized list of fees to be paid by grade), can be found <u>HERE</u>. School fees should now be paid. Any future fees, for events such as field trips, will be available on School Cash Online. When setting up your account be sure to check "YES" to receive email notifications so that you will be notified when fees are added. A direct link to School Cash Online and the school fee schedule can be found at the top of the Van Tech <u>website</u>.

## Absences & Attendance

## **Extended Absences**

Any students who will be away for an extended period of one week or more (travel, medical etc.) should see their grade counsellor to complete an extended absence form.

## Student Pick-up/Drop-off and Parking

Traffic signs are in place along Penticton Street to allow space for school buses to drop off and pick up students. Thank you for being compliant with city bylaws. Please note that several drivers have been ticketed in the past by the City of Vancouver. You can drop off and pick up students past the traffic signs further south along Penticton Street. Students are not permtted to park on school grounds, they may park on side Streets in designated parking areas.

#### School Cafeteria

Students can eat lunch on site, and we encourage students to utilize our outdoor spaces such as the garden and front lawn to get some fresh air. Healthy eating helps children learn. There are 3 options for purchasing lunch:

- Option 1: Pay by cash, debit, or credit card.
- Option 2: Download the <u>VSB Lunchsmart</u>™ App (QR codes on the poster linked <u>HERE</u>) and create an account then select the App's VSB CASH CARD. This VSB CASH CARD feature of the App, allows families to preload their account with funds and use a declining balance method to pay without the need for cash or using a credit card by simply scanning a barcode in the App.
- Option 3: Families may purchase a *Lunchsmart*™ card and pay the full amoforunt each month. Once purchased, this card can be linked to the <u>VSB Lunchsmart</u>™ App, allowing students the option of using their phone to scan a barcode. This card is limited to a one-time purchase of \$8.75 per day. A subsidy is available for families who require help with nutrition services at school. To register for the program and/or apply for a subsidy, please come to the school office to pick up the necessary forms.

### **Personal Digital Devices Guidelines**

Van Tech has an updated Code of Conduct which restrict students' use of personal digital devices during school hours: <u>Van Tech Personal Digital Devices Guidelines</u>. Personal digital devices must be turned off or placed on silent mode before students enter the classroom and remain silent during instructional time. Devices are not permitted for use during class/instructional time unless an educator has given permission. If you need to contact your child while they are at school, please call the Main Office.
