Parking on Frontenac – Continues to be a Challenge

Ongoing challenges have been continuing with parents and caregivers parking in DO NOT STOP zones, blocking visibility of pedestrians crossing at the crosswalk. This has created a very unsafe environment for our students. Police support has been requested once again to correct this problem. The city will also be notified and will issue tickets with photographic evidence of parking violations. <u>PLEASE do not speed in the school zone, or make three-point turns on Frontenac or park or stop within the no stopping zones indicated by signage</u> because drivers will not be able to properly see students crossing the road and it is not safe. For the safety of your children and the children of our community, please respect these bylaws and regulations. Parents, if you see unsafe driving and parking putting students at risk, *you are encouraged to make a report to the VPD non-emergency line (note the license plate, vehicle make and model and driver description).* The school will be setting out cones in the afternoon to block off the area of greatest concern near the pedestrian crossing.
