UPDATED LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT:

As you can see in the above banner, the Vancouver School Board has updated the Land Acknowledgement used in all VSB schools and District. The work was done with the 3 Host Nations through the Indigenous Education Team at VSB. This update provides consistent oral and written delivery of this important territory acknowledgement. The land acknowledgement is part of Maquinna's daily announcements, meetings and assemblies and is important as it provides relational information, speaks the truth of historical and ongoing processes of colonialism and the need for systemic changes of this ongoing problem.

KINDNESS AND "HANDS TO SELF":

We are finding some incidents where Maquinna students are not being kind to friends or to other students with mean words and actions, such as pushing, hitting, swearing (bad language) and getting carried away during physical games or jokes. Please help us at school with a chat with your child(ren) about their actions at school and our Code of Conduct: Respect Yourself, Respect Others and Respect this Place. We will continue learning about kindness and what it looks like during the month of February and beyond. Thank you.

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION CELL PHONE USE CHANGES:

Update: Provincial government announced restrictions on cell phones in schools for September 2024.

On Friday, January 26, the provincial government announced measures to improve student safety online. This included information about restricting cell phones in schools to be put in place by the next school year.

Currently, in the VSB, several measures are in place to guide appropriate use of cell phones and other devices. These including the <u>District Student Code of Conduct</u> and <u>Acceptable Use of Technology</u> administrative procedures. Staff will work with the Ministry of Education and Child Care to ensure that any necessary changes are implemented ahead of September 2024. More information will be shared as it becomes available.
