GROWTH MINDSET AND EMPATHY:

We continue our work with developing a growth mindset and empathy in our students. According to Carol Dweck, a growth mindset is a belief that our abilities can be developed through dedication and hard work. Empathy is an understanding of another person's experience by imagining oneself in that other person's situation. This builds understanding and perspective taking which leads to kindness, inclusion and tolerance. These concepts build resilience or "grit", a most important trait in successful students.

FLEXIBLE PLASTIC COLLECTION PILOT FOR MONTH OF MAY:

Division 4 is taking part in the Flexible Plastics School Collection Pilot program for the month of May. The goals of the program include knowledge and understanding of recycling of flexible plastics (aka soft plastic), collecting flexible plastics at school and encouraging the ongoing collection and recycling of this material at home once the pilot program is complete. Recycling prevents plastics ending up in our oceans and environment. Div. 4 and older students will be sorting the school plastics, bringing sorted plastics from home, and filling the "Super Sack" in the front entrance hallway. They welcome any flexible plastics from Maquinna families. Please see the attached flyer for examples of acceptable flexible plastics. The school will receive \$200 for participating and \$2/kilogram of flexible plastics collected. Thank you.
