FLEXIBLE PLASTICS COLLECTION FOR NOVEMBER

Maquinna school is again taking part in the Flexible Plastics School Collection Pilot program for the month of November under the sponsorship of Division 4. The goals of the program include knowledge and understanding of recycling of flexible plastics (aka soft plastic), collecting flexible plastics at school and encouraging the ongoing collection and recycling of this material at home once the pilot program is complete. Recycling prevents plastics ending up in our oceans and environment. Div. 4 and older students will be sorting the school plastics, bringing sorted plastics from home, and filling the "Super Sack" in the front entrance hallway. Please bring your flexible plastics from home so that they can be recycled. Please see the attached flyer for examples of acceptable clean, flexible plastics. The school will receive \$200 for participating and \$2/kilogram of flexible plastics collected. Last May, we were one of the top 3 schools and we received \$453.52 from our collection! Good job Maquinna!

SOCIAL MEDIA AWARENESS AND EDUCATION FOR PARENTS AND CAREGIVERS:

At school, we are currently experiencing some behaviours (inappropriate language, slang, games, gestures etc.) from students in Grades 2 and upwards, that may have been learned via social media (for example, YouTube, TikTok, online videos, chat groups, or online video games) and are inappropriate for the school setting. We are asking for your help in monitoring social media use and be aware of what children are viewing and sharing. We are looking at bringing some parent and student presentations to our school to help bring awareness and education to this concerning issue. Thank you.
