## Mandatory Grade 10 and Grade 12 Graduation Assessment Sessions – RESCHEDULED

Due to the BC General Employees' Union (BCGEU) strike action in the BC Public Service, the Grade 12 Graduation Literacy Assessment Session for November 2025 was cancelled by the Ministry of Education. As a result, both mandatory Grade 10 and Grade 12 Graduation Assessments have been rescheduled as follows:

- Grade 12 Literacy Assessments will be between **January 13 and 16, 2026.**
- Grade 10 Numeracy Assessments will be between **April 21 and 24, 2026.**
- Grade 10 Literacy Assessments will be between **June 16 and 19, 2026.**

Schedule details will be provided for students closer to the dates.

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## Athletics

### HAWKS

Where did the time go, it's already December? The fall season has come to a close, and the UHILL athletic program had some fantastic results! We are so proud of all the UHS student athletes and the hard work and effort they put in this fall season.

We had three girls volleyball teams competing this season (Bantam/Juvenile/Senior), and all had good seasons, competing well and having a blast along the way! We had one boys team (Junior), and they had a VERY strong season, placing 2<sup>nd</sup> in their pool during league play. Come playoffs, they made an awesome push, winning their QF match vs Gladstone before dropping the semifinal vs a strong DT team. They regrouped and won the consolation final vs Kits, finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> in the city, well done boys!!!

The soccer program had some strong results, with the senior and juvenile boys competing. The seniors had a tough season, selecting to play in Tier 1. They competed hard and did well in the more competitive league this season. The juvenile boys continued their strong play from last year, adding some quality players in grade 8, and finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in pool play. They won their QF game 3-0 vs Templeton and then ran into a tough Van tech team, losing the semifinal 2-0. A great season overall, well done!

Our cross-country squad had a very successful season, culminating with two students competing at the provincial championships in Nanaimo. Jason Li (gr 10) and Shengtong Su (gr 12) both ran a great race and did us all proud, well done!

The Aquatics team had a large team this year and saw some personal bests by a bunch of swimmers this year. We had four individual swimmers qualify for provincials (Emma Liu, Arman Hassani, Justin Wu, Noelle Deschambault) along with the boys relay team qualifying for two events (Justin Wu, Shengtong Su, Daniel Lei, Jeffy Koo). At the Aquatics provincial championship, UHill placed 4<sup>th</sup> overall in the mens category (with only 5 swimmers), and 13<sup>th</sup> overall in the women's category (with only 2 swimmers)!! The relay teams came 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> in their events, and Emma Liu placed 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in her 2 events, while Justin Wu came 4<sup>th</sup> in his event and Noelle Deschambault placed 25th. This is the highest ranking UHill has EVER achieved at an aquatics provincial so WELL DONE!

We are now entering the Winter sport season, with basketball and table tennis competitions. We have 3 boys' teams for basketball (gr 9, gr 10, senior), and 1 team on the girls' side (gr 8-9 team). We have two teams running for table tennis (1 boys team and 1 girls team) and we are looking forward to a strong showing from all our winter sports teams. Come out and support all our WINTER TEAMS!

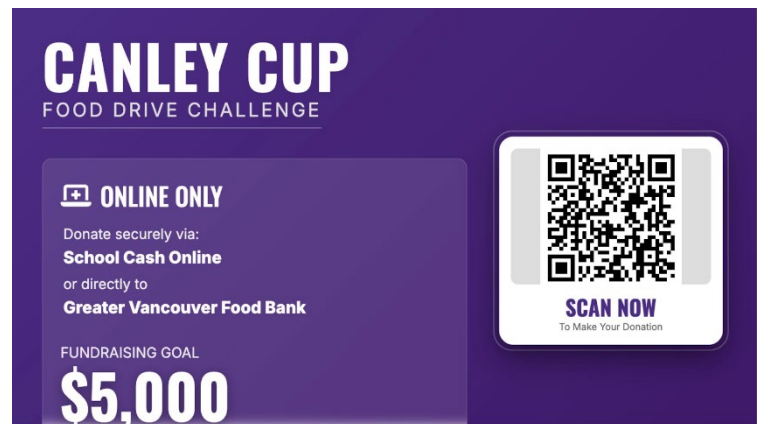
## UHill Food Drive for the Vancouver Food Bank

It is the student's responsibility to make up any work that is missed, regardless of the reason for the absence. Exceptions to this may be granted due to unforeseen circumstances. If a student becomes ill while at school, or has an appointment during school time, **students must sign out at the office** (and sign back in if they return the same day). **Students will only be released with parent permission.** Students who are ill should not come to school and if they attend school and are deemed to be unwell, parents/guardians will be contacted to pick up their child.
