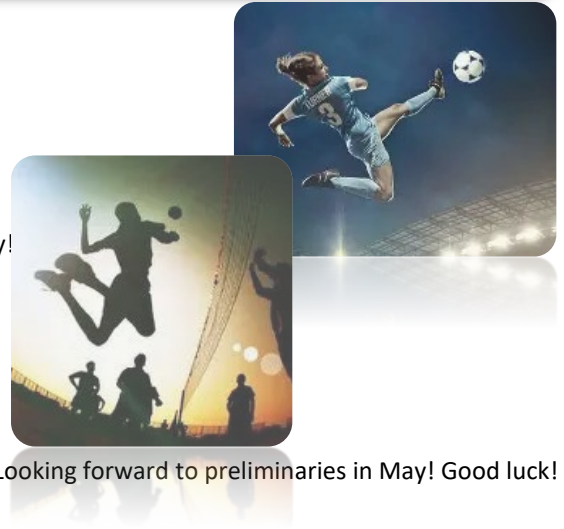
### WHITECAPS FC ACADEMY

The Whitecaps FC MLS Academy program is looking for host families in the UBC surrounding areas to host players for the duration of the upcoming school year. Becoming a Billet host in the MLS Academy program is a unique and rewarding experience, sharing day-to-day life with a young player developing towards their professional soccer career in the Whitecaps FC MLS Academy and continuing his education at University Hill Secondary School.

Each family will be given two 2026 MLS regular season tickets, as well as financial compensation to cover food and utility costs. As a family, you will provide a safe and comfortable living environment and physical nourishment, which includes three nutritious, prepared meals per day, seven days a week.

A typical MLS Academy season will begin in mid-August for pre-season preparation, with players travelling home for Christmas and Spring Break, finally culminating in June following the MLS NEXT Cup tournament. ## Immunization Clinic #2

Reminder of the upcoming Vancouver Coastal Health (VCH) Immunization Clinic on **Wednesday, May 20, 2026**. Students should eat breakfast beforehand and wear short-sleeved shirts. This VCH clinic is 2-fold as follows:

### Regular Vaccines:

Approximately 125 students were given a consent form, or a reminder notice, the week of April 21 for their immunization. Signed consent forms were due back to the school office by **April 29** to be returned to Vancouver Coastal Health (VCH).

Appointments will be scheduled alphabetically based on returned consent forms and be posted for students on Teams.

### HPV Vaccines:

VCH will also be hosting a free HPV vaccine clinic for Grade 10, 11 and 12 UHill students the same day! Students do not need a signed parent/guardian consent form or an appointment to receive their HPV vaccine. Simply come down to the LLC as your schedule permits.

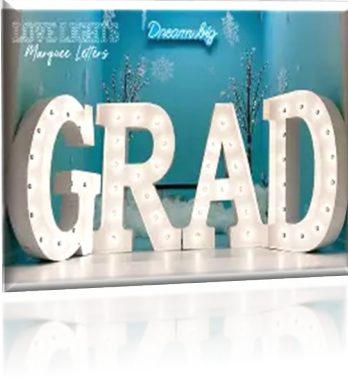

### Graduation Ceremony Tickets

**\*\* Please note CHANGES in ticket sales regarding rounds and number of tickets to purchase in each round\*\***

Grads **DO NOT** need to order a ticket for themselves. Each graduate will be able to order up to two complimentary tickets for their guests. **These two tickets, along with the grad's entrance, are included in the Graduation Fee of \$100 and is due as soon as possible**. Ordering details were sent via email on April 16. Additional tickets are \$10 each (no limits, subject to availability) and will be available for purchase from the Chan Centre website **May 1 to June 3**. Tickets will be released in 2 rounds as follows:

#### Ticketing Round 1: Opens Friday, May 1 (at 10:00 am) - Closes Wednesday, May 20 (at 11:59 pm)

- The Graduate does **NOT** need to order a ticket for themselves.
- Online ordering for a maximum of **2 complimentary guest tickets** and a **maximum of 2 additional paid tickets (\$10.00 each)** can be made in this round.
- **Any complimentary guest tickets MUST be ordered during this round**, and a Promo Code is required
- Order all your tickets for this round **in one order, the Promo Code can only be entered once**
- **No** first-round tickets are available after 11:59 pm on May 20.
- **There will be no exceptions for those who miss this reservation window**
- Any unclaimed tickets from the first round (including un-ordered complimentary tickets) are transferred to the extra ticket inventory and distributed in Ticketing Round 2.
- **This round is NOT first-come, first-served** - you do not need to order right at 10:00 am on May 1. **However, be sure to order well before the 11:59 pm May 20 deadline.**

#### Ticketing Round 2: Opens Friday, May 22 (at 10:00 am) on a first-come, first-served basis.

- Any unclaimed tickets from the previous round will become available (**no promo code required and no limits**).
- **These tickets are first-come, first-served basis** and your best chance to obtain extra tickets is to order them promptly at 10:00 am, but there are no guarantees that any additional tickets will be available at this time.
- Once tickets are sold out, there will be a Standby line set-up one hour prior to the ceremony, in case any further seats become available.

It is the student's responsibility to make up any work that is missed, regardless of the reason for the absence. Exceptions to this may be granted due to unforeseen circumstances. If a student becomes ill while at school, or has an appointment during school time, **students must sign out at the office** (and sign back in if they return the same day). **Students will only be released with parent permission.** Students who are ill should not come to school and if they attend school and are deemed to be unwell, parents/guardians will be contacted to pick up their child.
