#### 1. Welcome

- 2. Approval of Minutes from January 2023 by June Liang and seconded by Dr. Bashar

## 3. Staff Update – Yashoda Reddy

- a. Beginning of January, we had the Trojan invitational after a couple years. A great tournament and lots of positive school spirit.

- a. Lots happened in the school this month and lots to happen this year, its nice to see things open up again as everything was online or not available due to COVID. Its great to see students having access to outside presentations and participating in community events.

- c. Weekly WAG week at glance is something new that will be emailed out to parents on a weekly basis
- d. Grade Dates May 25: Rehearsal, June 1: Grad, June 8: Grad Breakfast, June 23: Prom more information will be coming to parents in a letter/email after spring break.
- e. Opioid Tour was very popular its good for students to have this knowledge
- f. BC Lions came in to present Anti Racism Presentation for Grade 8 and 9 Students. Very good and informative for students.
- g. Ignite Presentations for Grade 10 & 11 tomorrow where students can learn what or why people choose the career they have today, the school will have lawyers, doctors, artists, dentists visit the school and present.
- h. 2 good films presented to students for Black History Month on ReelCanada. These movies are filmed and produced in Canada.
- i. Pink Shirt Day TLC cards with the code of conducts on them, given out to students who perform/carry the code of conducts well and then names out into a draw to win a gift card. Last week new TLC cards were created for Pink Day and were given out instead to create a Bully Free Atmosphere.

- I. Hold and Secure event at the school last week, had some intruders enter the school that were high schooler from another school. They came looking for a specific student and were carrying bear spray. As these students were leaving the school, they sprayed the Bear Spray which made it unsafe for students to leave their classrooms. Therefore, when the 3<sup>rd</sup> period bell rang, the students were asked to Hold & Secure. This means the students are not allowed to leave the classroom and the school doors are locked so no one can enter the building. Please note that classes are still being taught. The police arrived at the scene right away and the students were apprehended. This was not a lock down and was a hold and secure.
- The following week the same student came to the school again, and the student was taken into the office and decided to walk away. There was PA miss announcement made saying that the students should be held for a few minutes before its safe to go home. However, that was not necessary and a proper system has been put into place.
- n. The student is now banned from coming to the property and if seen again, the student can be arrested for trespassing. Police are aware of the incident.

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o. All visitors must report to the office as they arrive, if there are any unknown activity students report to staff right away. There is also admin staff at lunch time to monitor the students.
