## **Student Learning Survey 2022-2023**

Parents – We need your help!

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size, and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

The survey is administered to students in grades 4 and 7, their parents/guardians, and all school staff (*if you have a child in grade 4 and/or 7, he/she brought home an additional notice detailing survey instructions*). We encourage parents/guardians to participate in this survey, as results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the Province, in addition, questions from the school/district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included.

The anonymous survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the internet at: <u>http://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat\_survey</u>. Any computer with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link under the Parent section without a logon code by selecting school district (39 Vancouver) and the school name (Dr George M Weir).

The e-survey will be open until April 29<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

#### Big One at 2:00pm

On **Thursday, May 4**<sup>th</sup>, we will have our yearly, district-wide earthquake drill. This is an opportunity for us to practice our processes in the event of major earthquake. This includes all the elements of our standard

earthquake drills (drop and cover, count to sixty, evacuate building, take attendance) as well as further practices that would be required should a major earthquake occur including:

- Rapid damage assessment
- Initializing an incident command and critical response team
- Assessing supplies on hand
- Parent reunification protocol (Kindergarten classes only)



\*Parents/guardians of Kindergarten students will be required to pick up their children at 2:15pm from the reunification station located at the Weir side entrance of Killarney St. (signs will be posted). We can also release students to those other contacts identified on the Emergency Reunification Form. We will be sending a notice home to our Kindergarten families with further details next week.

NEW: Speed Reduction in School Zone on Rupert St. (between 44<sup>th</sup>-45<sup>th</sup> Ave.)



### Speed Reduction in School Zones Adjacent to Arterials and Collectors George M. Weir Elementary

The City of Vancouver is working to eliminate all traffic-related fatalities and serious injuries in Vancouver through our Vision Zero Safety Program. In May 2022, Council approved the *Schools on Arterials Slow Zones* pilot to reduce speed limits at school zones on arterial and collector streets Citywide.

George M. Weir Elementary is one of nine Vancouver schools participating in the pilot. The speed limit will be lowered from 50 km/h to **40 km/h**, in effect from **8am – 5pm School Days**, at **5900 Rupert St.** between E 44<sup>th</sup> Ave. and E 45<sup>th</sup> Ave. (see figure below).

The official launch of the speed limit reduction is Monday, **March 27, 2023,** after spring break. Key changes along Rupert St. will include:

• New regulatory speed limit signage posted for both directions

• Additional school zone signage and one large custom sign at E 44<sup>th</sup> Ave.

• 40 km/h pavement markings at entry points for both directions (to be installed in June) • There will be no changes to vehicle access or parking

ENGINEERING SERVICES Transportation Division



As part of our educational campaign, volunteers with the Community Policing Centres will provide support through the Speed Watch program. They will be out on the roads near the school to provide drivers with real-time feedback on their speeds as a reminder to drive safely and stay within the posted speed limit. After an initial grace period of 1-2 months for drivers to adjust to the speed limit change, staff will coordinate with the Vancouver Police Department for official enforcement with ticketing.
