


Photo Retake Day – Friday, December 2nd

Snow Closure

EpiPens

- Allergy is Life-Threatening Your child needs to wear the EpiPen at all times at school. Please ensure that your child has an EpiPen case or holder that they can wear.
- Allergy does not pose threat to life We will store your child's EpiPen in a labelled, secured drawer in the First Aid room.



Westcoast Weather

In alignment with other VSB elementary schools, Weir has a westcoast weather policy. This means that we expect students and staff to dress for the weather. We will go outside for recess and lunch during light rain and snow conditions. In periods of excessively heavy rain or snow, we will hold inside recess and lunch periods.



Expansion to the Weir School Catchment

The District is seeking input about proposed <u>boundary changes</u> that affect Carleton, Cunningham, Weir and MacCorkindale school catchments. The District proposes to reduce the Carleton catchment area and expand catchment boundaries for Cunningham, Weir and MacCorkindale.

As you may know, students who reside in the Carleton catchment area have been attending neighbouring schools since the building was closed following a fire in 2016. The proposed catchment area changes will prioritize convenience and choice for Carleton catchment families by enabling them to easily apply to nearby catchment schools.

Feedback received through this engagement will be provided to the Board for their consideration as per <u>AP 305</u>. Please note that the Board has not yet decided on any catchment changes.

Weir staff had a powerful day of learning on Friday, November 25th where we explored what Truth and Reconciliation looks like in our school. We have committed to quite a few actions to start and others to continue alongside our learners including a morning acknowledgment of the traditional territories.



Where are the Bells?!?!?!

Families who drop off and pick up their child(ren) from school might have noticed that we have reduced the duration and frequency of school bells at our school. During the industrial revolution, school bells were used to help transition students into post-graduation jobs in factories that operated on bell systems to start and stop the shifts of factory workers. In addition, bells can also be quite upsetting for our students with extra sensory needs. As an effort to create a more peaceful environment in our school that respects that learning involves patience and time, we have limited our bells to signal the beginning of our day and the end of recess and lunch.



Keeping Ourselves Healthy

We are firmly in cold and flu season at the moment. With the continued presence of Covid, we need to continue to practice disease prevention practices to reduce disease transmission including:
