First Week Schedule

A repeat from the recent back to school email on August 28th:

Please note: As per instructions from district management, we are not yet permitted to enter into our new classes for this school year. This is due to a large number of students that need to be placed into schools across the district. The plan below is developed with these instructions in mind and are

consistent with other VSB elementary schools. Our curricular plan for the week will involve character building lessons related to self-confidence, integrity, perseverance, curiosity, and community-building.

Tuesday, September 5th – 9:00am – 10:00am

Students attend for one hour to check-in and verify attendance.

- **Returning Students** please meet your previous year's teacher at the same pick-up location as last year on the asphalt.
- **New Students** (except Kindergarten) please meet Ms. Burma, Ms. Nguyen, Ms. Wan, and Ms. McClenahan at the undercover area. They will have lists.

Wednesday, September 6th – 9:00am – 3:03pm

Students return to last year's teacher except students in Gr. 1 who will be with Ms. Lee, Ms. Hsu, and Mr. Dodds. New students will be given a class to join (typically one with same age peers). We will have many staff members circulating with lists to ensure this goes smoothly.

Thursday, September 7th – 9:00am – 3:03pm

Same routine as Wednesday.

Friday, September 8th – 9:00am – 3:03pm

TBD – we will be waiting for permission from district management to move into this year's classes. If we are asked to hold off, we will follow the same routine as Wednesday and Thursday.

Pick Up and Drop Off



Over the past two years, our students have lined up outside our school each morning. Their teachers come outside to meet them and greet them individually as they enter the school. This allows our teachers to have a short moment with each student at the beginning of the day. This small moment provides our teachers with valuable information about each student and how they are doing.

We will continue this practice at Weir. At 8:55am, a 'get ready for class' bell will ring. Students will line up behind cones placed at the blue 'x's in the photo. The cones will have their teacher's name and division number on them. The teachers will come out to greet their class and bring them inside. At the end of the day, teachers will walk them back outside to the same place. This will help students practice entering the building calmly and start the day in a peaceful way.

Discord and Online Safety – Help us Break the Cycle



Every year, students sign a digital responsibility contract. This agreement is the guideline for how our students use technology and devices both during and outside of school hours. Staff who work with our intermediate students often spend many hours dealing with issues that arise from online interactions between students that take place outside of school hours. These issues often affect the climate of classrooms and can strain relationships amongst students. **The vast majority of issues come from Weir student groups on the Discord app**. While we do our best to address these issues as they arise, please help us by:

- having frequent discussions with your children about online safety (e.g. stranger danger, online bullying etc)
- understanding what social media sites they use (particularly the ones with direct messaging)
- letting your kids know that you can do regular device checks
- agreeing on a time each night to shut down devices and store them outside of their bedrooms.
- remind your kids that they should not write things to anyone that they would not say in person

The Vancouver School Board offers the service of purchasing basic school supplies in bulk at wholesale prices and passing the cost savings on to families. The School Supply Fee for 2022 – 2023 is \$35.00 per student.

This fee covers basic consumable school supplies used for students' personal use such as paper, writing tools, glue sticks, erasers, exercise books and art supplies. Supplies are provided for the full year.

Student Planners

We received notification from our student planner vendor, First Class Planners, that their storage facility was unfortunately affected by the wildfires this summer in BC. Luckily, none of their staff were injured during the fire. As a result, along with most Vancouver elementary schools, our student planners will be delayed in arriving. First Class Planners is working very hard to reprint all of our planners and anticipates delivery in two to four weeks.

Code of Conduct



Our code of conduct is what guides our work in schools and outlines clear expectations for our students. While students do have consequences for their actions, we prefer to navigate conflicts with a restorative lens. Under staff supervision, students need to meet with those who are impacted, hear how their actions affected others, and then decide on actions to take to restore the relationship and repair the harm done. Our approach can change slightly depending on the age of the student, events and situations surrounding the incident, and past behavioural history.

The Code of Conduct will be in your child's planner. We encourage you to review it with them at home. It can also be found <u>here</u> on our website.

Killarney Street Construction:

As many of you will have noticed, the construction along the Killarney St. side of our school is not yet completed. We have been in contact with the City of Vancouver many times over the past six months and have expressed our concern over safety issues and the length of time this area has been unavailable to our families for pick up and drop off.
