Some Unacceptable Behaviours

(these examples are not an all-inclusive list)

- Disrespect of other students (e.g. rude words, exclusion)
- Vandalism/littering
- Physically harming others
- Dangerous play
- Disruptive noise
- Cheating
- Bullying/Harassment
- Retaliation
- Destruction or damage to property
- Inappropriate internet use
- Stealing
- Possession or use of illegal or restricted substances
- Possession of real or fake weapons or other inappropriate items

Weir Elementary promotes the values expressed in the **BC Human Rights Code**. Students shall not discriminate against others on the basis of race, religion, colour, ancestry, place of origin, marital status, family status, age, gender, identity/expression, sexual orientation, and physical or mental disability, or for any other reason set out in the Human Rights code of British Columbia. Nor shall a student publish or display anything that would indicate an intention to discriminate against another or expose them to contempt or ridicule on the basis of such grounds. **Racism and discrimination of any kind will not be tolerated at our school.**

Suspension Process

In accordance with the School Act, Sec. 85 (2)(ii) and (d), the Board authorizes the principal or designate to suspend a student from attendance at school for up to five days. Suspensions may be for the following reasons:

- a student is willfully and repeatedly disrespectful to a teacher or to any other employee of the Board carrying out responsibilities approved by the board
- significant breaches of the District Code of Conduct or other policy and/or has a harmful effect on others of the learning environment of the school;
- a student has failed to comply with the School Code of Conduct

*Suspensions over five days are made in consultation with the appropriate Director of Instruction as per <u>District Student</u> <u>Code of Conduct, AP 350</u>. As per AP 350 7.7 an educational program must be provided.

Consequences

- Consequences are intended to be consistent, preventative, fair, supportive, and restorative.
- Students are expected to learn and mature as they
 move through successive grades, and as such the
 expectations progress towards increasing personal
 responsibility and self-discipline, as well as increasing
 consequences for inappropriate conduct/unacceptable
 behavior.
- Repetitive or severe unacceptable behaviour may result in increased severity of subsequent disciplinary action. The age and maturity of students are considered when determining appropriate consequences.
- Special considerations may apply to students with special/diverse needs if these students are unable to comply with a code of conduct due to having a disability/challenge of an intellectual, physical, sensory, emotional, or behavioural nature.
- All reasonable steps will be taken to prevent retaliation against a student who has made a complaint of a breach of a code of conduct.

Examples of Consequences

Level 1 - Minor Incidents:

- Problem solving discussion with the classroom teacher
- Reflective questions and restorative actions

Level 2 – Repeated Misbehaviour:

As in level 1 plus...

- Incident recorded
- Loss of privileges eg. Playground
- Removal of possession eg. toy
- School Community Service
- Staff/Parents informed as needed
- Restorative Justice circles and actions

Level 3 – Serious Problems, Refusal, or Inability to Change:

As in Level 1 and 2 plus...

- Administration informed
- Behaviour/Safety Plan as needed
- Suspension in accordance with VSB Policy

Notification/Supports

The principal or designate has a responsibility to inform other parties of serious breaches of the code of conduct. These parties may include: staff, parent(s) of student offender(s), parent(s) of student victim(s) in every instance, school district officials, police and/or other agencies as required by law, school community, when deemed necessary, to reassure members that school officials are taking appropriate action.
