JQ Cross Country Program



The JQ cross country program will begin next week. Cross country **practices** will be held on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 8:00 to 8:45am at Camosun Park. Practices will be led by parent and volunteer coaches. M Sankey (bsankey@vsb.bc.ca) is the lead teacher contact for cross country and there will be a rotation of school staff supervisors present at all practices and meets. Students will be accompanied by adults to school once practice is over. Please ensure the cross country consent form is brought to the first practice your child attends. See the staff supervisor for attendance.

Mini meets with neighbouring schools will take place at Camosun Park after school. The mini meet schedule is as follows:

- Tuesday October 1, 3:15-4:45 PM, Grades K-3 only
- Thursday October 3, 3:15-4:45 PM, Grade 4-7 only
- Wednesday October 9, 3:15-4:45 PM, All grades

The district finals will take place at Trout Lake on October 22nd.

This year, there will be a new format for students in Kindergarten to Grade 3 in the cross country meets. All K-3 students will now run with their peers in the same grade, without differentiating their gender. They will be racing based on their grade and heat number according to school name*. This change supports our Education Plan and our commitment to fostering an inclusive environment for all students. Additionally, every student participating in these races will receive a participation ribbon to celebrate their effort and enthusiasm.

Punctuality

It is important to be on time.

Being on time prevents disruption to your child's learning and that of others. Some activities start promptly at 9:00 am. In addition, it shows respect for your child's teacher and other educators.

A welcome bell rings at 8:55 am and this is the time for students to line up and be met by the teacher. The beginning of learning day bell rings at 9:00 am and hopefully all students are present and ready to head to the classroom.

Dismissal this year is at 2:58 pm. We also request that students be picked up on time, this is especially important for younger children who may become upset when a parent is late.

If possible, with the exception of new Kindergarten students, we would ask that parents sign the Neighbourhood Class Walk Consent (no. 6 on the list) as soon as possible. Next week, teachers may wish to take their students offsite for a walk in the neighbourhood or to Pacific Spirit Park. Your consent would allow for this type of outing. Thank you.

Personal Digital Devices during school hours



As you may know, in January 2024, the Province of B.C. mandated all school boards to update their Codes of Conduct to limit students' use of personal digital devices during school hours.

Elementary

Personal digital devices are now restricted throughout the instructional day (9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.). This includes class time, recess and lunch. Devices must be turned off or set to silent mode and kept out of sight for the entire school day.

Schools may provide additional information or guidelines to support the updated Code of Conduct⁶ (section 1.3.5). We kindly ask everyone to join us in encouraging students to develop digital literacy skills and use technology solely for educational purposes while at school.
