Flexible/Soft Plastics Collection Program



Monsieur Sankey's Division 2 class has signed up to be JQ's Flexible/Soft Plastics Collection Program Champion.

A giant bin has been placed outside the staff room to collect flexible/soft plastics.

The program goals are:

• Increasing knowledge and understanding about the recycling of flexible plastics (aka soft plastic),

• Collecting flexible plastic at school, and

• Encouraging the ongoing collection and recycling of this material at home once the pilot program is complete.

Timing: The program will end during the week of December 9th.


What kind of flexible plastic is eligible for collection? This program is collecting residential flexible plastic like the kind often found in student lunches. For example, zipper-lock bags and stand up pouches, crinkly granola bar wrappers and chip bags, and plastic grocery-type bags. This program will also accept flexible plastics collected from home – for example, bread bags, flexible packaging, outer bags and overwrap, and woven plastic bags.

What's in it for our school? The school will receive a \$200 honorarium and Recycle BC will pay \$2.00 per kilogram of flexible plastic collected! This money could be used for classroom prizes, library resources on recycling and sustainability, other resources the school needs or donated to a charity chosen by the school.

How can you help? Families are invited to send in flexible/soft plastics from home during the duration of the project and bring them to their classroom.

Traffic and Parking



The neighbourhood has requested that we remind parents of the parking zones around the school.

Please note that there is No Stopping on Crown Street on school days. Students can be picked up and dropped off along West 14th Avenue and vehicles can stop for 3 minutes parking.

Drop-off and pick-up traffic should flow clockwise around the school. Keep the area round the school a safe place to walk, bike and roll by following the posted signs. If you are driving, consider the "Drive to Five" initiative. Park five minutes away and walk to school.

VSB Severe Weather Closures



VSB has procedures in place for when severe weather, like heavy snowfall or extremely high winds, may affect schools.

During severe weather events, all schools in the Vancouver School District will remain open, if possible. If a District-wide closure is necessary, that will be decided and publicized by 6:30 a.m.

District-wide school closures will be announced through the media, the District website⁴, school websites and the our social media channels.

How are decisions made about school closures:

We monitor forecasts and conditions, and work with the City of Vancouver and other partners to assess safety when there may be:

- heavy snowfall
- extreme cold
- freezing rain
- extreme heat
- other hazardous weather/emergency conditions that pose risks to student and staff safety

We coordinate with neighbouring school districts to align our decisions where possible.

The decision to close schools is made in consideration of safety, equity and well-being.

We consider other impacts weather conditions may have, like transit delays, meal programs for students, other essential student supports and impacts to learning. If weather conditions begin or worsen during a school day, usually, schools will remain open until the end of the school day.

Except under extreme circumstances, all schools and offices will remain open, if possible. Typically, no announcement will be made that schools are open. Only cancellations, closures or delayed school openings will be announced.

Extra-curricular activities, school events and field trips may be cancelled because of weather – even when school remains open.

Remember to dress for the weather and take extra care when traveling between school and home. Drivers are reminded to slow down and remain alert in and around school zones.

What if I don't think it is safe for my child to go to school due to weather conditions?

Student safety is our top priority. If for any reason a parent/guardian feels that a child cannot travel safely to/from school, they can notify their child's schools about the expected absence. Students will not be penalized.

Pick-up for Appointments

A friendly reminder to notify your child's teacher in advance if you will be picking up your child to take to an appointment during the school day. Pick-up or drop-off at the beginning or end of recess or lunch breaks is preferred to minimize class disruption. Thank you for your consideration.

Kindergarten registration for children born in 2020 begins on November 1



All kindergarten applicants are required to complete an online application for their English catchment elementary school. This includes families who wish to apply for District Choice programs (Early French Immersion, Montessori, Indigenous Focus School, Early Mandarin Bilingual, Nootka Fine Arts) and/or make a cross boundary application to attend a noncatchment school.

The priority registration period for kindergarten opens on **November 1** and closes on **January 31**. Students who submit an online application within this priority period will be accommodated before late applicants.

Applying for kindergarten is a **2-step process**:

Step 1: Online Application (ApplyNow)

 Completion of an online application form (<u>https://applynow.vsb.bc.ca/</u>) for the school year 2025-26

Step 2: Verification of documentation

- Contact your English catchment school office to set up an appointment to bring your supporting documentation
- Bring supporting documentation to your English catchment school office during your scheduled appointment

Supporting documents needed:

- 1. Proof of residence in Vancouver
- 2. Child's birth certificate
- 3. Immigration documentation (if applicable)
- 4. Immunization records
- 5. Court orders/documents (if applicable)

If you want to apply for a District Choice Program or cross boundary, you must **first apply to your English catchment elementary school**. District Choice Programs and cross boundary applications will be accepted in early 2025. For more information, go to: govsb.ca/kchoice¹⁰ and govsb.ca/crossboundary¹¹

Between January 7, 2025 and February 4, 2025 you can apply for up to three choice programs through our online application process¹². To apply you must have completed your child's Registration at their English Catchment School by the end of January. The application period for Kindergarten Choice Programs closes on February 4, 2025 at 4pm.





TIPS for supporting your child's French education.

Most French immension parents have either a limited knowledge of French or cannot speak the language at all. If you don't speak French yourself, it is not suggested you read to your child in French now. However, any reading that you do in your first language is recommended and the reading skills that are learned, such as vocabulary development and reading from left to right, can be transferred to French.

Being able to read words and sound out letters are important aspects of learning to read but true reading involves reading for meaning and making connections with our own personal experiences. Diliden should be encouraged to durity what they read through pictures, questions and decision and refeating the story. This kests to peter understanding and comprehension.

Here are some simple suggestions for children in primary immersion:

- · Be enthusiastic and positive.
- Read often to your child in English (or your first language)
- · Provide French resources eg. French dictionaries, DVDs, CDs, books, comic books.
- · Consider putting them into a French language summer day camp.
- Discover French internet web sites.
- Join the local chapter of your Canadian Parents for French to network with other immersion parents, access services and to keep informed about developments in French second language education.
- Sign up for an adult French course geared to French immersion parents.
- Listen to French radio and watch French shows or movies.
- · Hire a tutor or babysitter who speaks French to play with your child.

Try to develop the best relationship possible between you and your child's teacher, making If y to develop the best relationship possible develop you and your childs search, in teamwork the main theme. Asking about your children's homework and praising them for its completion as well as allowing them to tell you about their day will help create a more positive environment about school in general.
