Flexible/Soft Plastics Collection Program - last week



Families have one more week to drop off any flexible/soft plastics with Monsieur Sankey's Division 2 class and help them become Flexible/Soft Plastics Program Champions.

A giant bin has been placed in Monsieur Sankey's classroom (Rm 305) to collect flexible/soft plastics.

The program goals are:

- Increasing knowledge and understanding about the recycling of flexible plastics (aka soft plastic),
- Collecting flexible plastic at school, and
- Encouraging the ongoing collection and recycling of this material at home once the pilot program is complete.

Timing: The program will end during the week of December 9th.

What kind of flexible plastic is eligible for collection? This program is collecting residential flexible plastic like the kind often found in student lunches. For example, zipper-lock bags and stand up pouches, crinkly granola bar wrappers and chip bags, and plastic grocery-type bags. This program will also accept flexible plastics collected from home – for example, bread bags, flexible packaging, outer bags and overwrap, and woven plastic bags.

What's in it for our school? The school will receive a \$200 honorarium and Recycle BC will pay \$2.00 per kilogram of flexible plastic collected! This money could be used for classroom prizes, library resources on recycling and sustainability, other resources the school needs or donated to a charity chosen by the school.

How can you help? Families are invited to send in flexible/soft plastics from home during the duration of the project and bring them to their classroom.

Upcoming Book Sale - Dec. 12

When: Thursday, December 12th, during school hours

Grade 7 students will be hosting a book sale, a perfect chance for students to buy gifts for siblings or parents.

Donations of gently used books are welcome and can be dropped off in the box near the office stairs until Monday, December 9th, by 3 PM.

Parents may wish to send their children to school with some small change to buy books next Thursday. Kindergarten registration for children born in 2020 begins on November 1



All kindergarten applicants are required to complete an online application for their English catchment elementary school. This includes families who wish to apply for District Choice programs (Early French Immersion, Montessori, Indigenous Focus School, Early Mandarin Bilingual, Nootka Fine Arts) and/or make a cross boundary application to attend a noncatchment school.

The priority registration period for kindergarten opens on **November 1** and closes on **January 31**. Students who submit an online application within this priority period will be accommodated before late applicants.

Applying for kindergarten is a **2-step process**:

Step 1: Online Application (ApplyNow)

 Completion of an online application form (<u>https://applynow.vsb.bc.ca/</u>) for the school year 2025-26

Step 2: Verification of documentation

- Contact your English catchment school office to set up an appointment to bring your supporting documentation
- Bring supporting documentation to your English catchment school office during your scheduled appointment

Supporting documents needed:

- 1. Proof of residence in Vancouver
- 2. Child's birth certificate
- 3. Immigration documentation (if applicable)
- 4. Immunization records
- 5. Court orders/documents (if applicable)

If you want to apply for a District Choice Program or cross boundary, you must **first apply to your English catchment elementary school**. District Choice Programs and cross boundary applications will be accepted in early 2025. For more information, go to: govsb.ca/kchoice⁷ and govsb.ca/crossboundary⁸

Between January 7, 2025 and February 4, 2025 you can apply for up to three choice programs through our online application process⁹. To apply you must have completed your child's Registration at their English Catchment School by the end of January. The application period for Kindergarten Choice Programs closes on February 4, 2025 at 4pm.

JQ Salmon Stream - walking school bus

We are excited to announce the launch of our Walking School Bus (WSB) initiative, also known as the JQ Salmon Stream! (Thank you to Barend for coming up with this great name at our PAC meeting!) This program aims to encourage active and safe transportation to school while fostering a sense of community and fun among our students and families.

The idea for the Walking School Bus was discussed during a PAC meeting last year, with representatives from the Society for Children and Youth of BC present to address questions and concerns. For more details, you can review the meeting minutes here¹³ and the accompanying presentation here¹⁴.

How It Works

We aim to kickstart the JQ Salmon Stream with all participants walking together, which helps to build community spirit while promoting active and safe transportation to school. Currently, two parents **Valerie Balaski and Nafisa Fera**, both parents of Grade 4 and Grade 2 students have volunteered to lead the initial routes. Each leader will walk one morning a week starting at a designated meeting point. **Over time, we hope more parents will volunteer to expand the number of walking routes and days.**

Parents are expected to act responsibly... Unless they have acted in a negligent manner and that negligence caused the injury, they have nothing to fear."



TIPS for supporting your child's French education.

Most French immension parents have either a limited knowledge of French or cannot speak the language at all. If you don't speak French yourself, it is not suggested you read to your child in French now. However, any reading that you do in your first language is recommended and the reading skills that are learned, such as vocabulary development and reading from left to right, can be transferred to French.

Being able to read words and sound out letters are important aspects of learning to read but true reading involves reading for meaning and making connections with our own personal experiences. Publicen should be encouraged to durity what they read through pictures, questions and decision and refeating the story. This kests to peter understanding and comprehension.

Here are some simple suggestions for children in primary immersion:

- · Be enthusiastic and positive.
- Read often to your child in English (or your first language)
- · Provide French resources eg. French dictionaries, DVDs, CDs, books, comic books. · Consider putting them into a French language summer day camp.
- Discover French internet web sites.
