### Erik Erikson's 8 Stages of Development:

Erik Erikson, a renowned psychologist, outlined eight stages of psychosocial development that people experience throughout their lives. Each stage represents a unique challenge or task that contributes to a person's sense of self and relationships. For school-age children, this often involves building confidence, navigating peer relationships, and developing a sense of competence. Understanding these stages can offer helpful insights into how children grow and adapt during different phases of life.

Every year, the BC Ministry of Education collects the opinions of all parents and students in grades **4**, **7**, 10 and 12 and all staff through the Provincial Student Learning Survey. The questions it asks measure areas such as achievement, human and social development, health, and safety at school. School districts use survey results for planning, improvement, and goal setting. Students will take the survey at school. **Parents are invited and encouraged to take the survey at home,** all responses remain anonymous, and everyone's participation is entirely voluntary.
