Student Information and Consent Forms

Information and forms were sent home in September. Thank you to everyone who completed the request tasks as it helps the school's keep the information about your child current. If you have not completed the forms yet, please complete them as soon as possible. Remembrance Day Service

All parents and family members are invited to attend our annual Remembrance Day service to be held on Friday, November 8th at 11:00am in the gymnasium. Next week students will be collecting donations for the Vancouver Poppy Fund. All students will receive a poppy on the day of the service.



Kindergarten registration for children born in 2020 begins on November 1. All kindergarten applicants are required to submit an application to their English catchment elementary school. This includes families who wish to apply for choice programs (Early French Immersion, Montessori, Indigenous Focus School, Early Mandarin Bilingual, Nootka Fine Arts) and/or make a cross boundary application to attend a non-catchment school.

The priority registration period for Kindergarten opens on **November 1** and closes on **January 31**. Students who submit an application within this priority period will be accommodated <u>before</u> late applicants.

Applying for kindergarten is a **<u>2-step process</u>**:

Step 1: Online Application (ApplyNow)

Completion of an online application form

 (<u>https://applynow.vsb.bc.ca/</u>) for the school year

 2025-2026. Click on the 2025-2026 button!

Step 2: Verification of documentation

- Contact your English catchment school office to <u>set</u> <u>up an appointment</u> to bring your supporting documentation

- Bring supporting documentation to your English catchment school office during your scheduled appointment

Supporting documents needed:

- 1. Proof of residence in Vancouver
- 2. Child's birth certificate
- 3. Immigration documentation (if applicable)
- 4. Immunization records
- 5. Court orders/documents (if applicable)

If you want to apply for a Choice Program or cross-boundary, you must <u>first apply</u> <u>to your English catchment elementary school</u>. Choice Programs and Cross Boundary applications will begin to be accepted in early 2025.

In the event there are more in-catchment applicants than available space* at the school, the following process will be used to prioritize enrolment:

Kindergarten Applications Received Between November 1 and January 31

- 1. **In-catchment** kindergarten applicants with siblings in attendance at the school (and who will be attending next year) will be placed first.
- 2. The names of all other in-catchment registrants will be entered into a **random draw** for the remaining kindergarten spaces.
- 3. Students who cannot be accommodated will be placed on a waitlist in the order in which their name was drawn.
- 4. Between January 31 and the second Friday in June students on the ordered waitlist will be accommodated as space becomes available.

Kindergarten Registrations Received AFTER January 31st

In-catchment kindergarten students who apply **after** January 31 will be accommodated if there is space. If there is no space, their names will be added to the bottom of the existing waitlist. **Note**: There will be **no priority** given to registrants with siblings if they register after January 31.

* Available Space includes physical capacity, resources, staffing, or educational programs available or planned for a school as defined by the District (Administrative Procedure 300).


Communicating Student Learning

Throughout the year, parents will receive various communications from teachers.

- a written progress report on December 16th and March 10th
- a written summative report at the end of the year on June 25th
- at least two informal learning updates of student learning through conferences and others forms of communication.

In relation to the learning standards from the BC Curriculum, the written reports will include:

- A Provincial Proficiency Scale for all areas of learning currently being studied.
- descriptive feedback describing student strengths, areas for growth and opportunities for further development.
- information about student attendance.
- student self-reflection of the Core Competencies and student goal setting.
