Dropping Off - Picking Up Your Child

School staff provide supervision starting at 8:40am in the morning and after school only until 3:20pm. Parents are asked to be on time and ensure that their children understand the family's drop-off and pick-up arrangements. Please do not be late picking up your child. If some unforeseen event happens and you will be late, please contact the school office.




Student Sign-Out and Late Sign-In Procedure

When you pick up your child during the school day, please ensure that you tell the teacher ahead of time and sign them out at the school office. If you do not sign out your child, they will be unaccounted for, and the school will identify your child as a 'missing' student and will commence a search of school grounds.

If the school staff do not locate the child, and are unable to reach a parent promptly, the school may call the Vancouver Police Department. Therefore, clear communication is essential for ensuring the safety of your child and to prevent unnecessary searches. As well if you are arriving after 9:00 a.m. please 'Sign-In Late' with the office. Thank you for helping us keep your children safe!

Trudeau Elementary Traffic Guidelines



- No parking allowed in front of the school as city signs state.
- Quick drop off and pick-up ONLY.
- -No U-turns are permitted as they present a danger for students crossing the street.
- Only staff are allowed to drive into and walk in the staff parking lot.
- Please do not bring your children through the staff parking lot as this is unsafe as young children cannot be seen when a car is pulling out of a parking spot.

We appreciate the efforts of drivers who follow these instructions and therefore working with the school to ensure a safe arrival and departure every day for each student. Thank you!

Cellphones and Electronic Devices

Electronic devices are a big part of our lives. They are very expensive and can be lost or stolen easily. At Trudeau Elementary, we encourage students to keep expensive belongings safe at home. For emergencies, students can use our office phone to call home.

Cell phones and electronic devices can be used by students for learning with teacher permission and supervision. Recess and lunch breaks are for socializing, face to face communication and physical activity. We ask that parents refrain from communicating (e.g. calling and texting) students during instructional hours. Thank you for your support

Lunch will be eaten in classrooms this year under staff supervision. Please remember to send a water bottle to school as well so your child can fill it up at our fill station and please place the necessary utensils in their lunch bags. If a student forgets their lunch and you need to drop it off, please bring it to the office, labelled with their name and put it on the table designated for lunches.

Meet the Teacher

There will be a brief introduction of the staff in the gymnasium and then each teacher will give two 15-minute sessions about their program. This is a chance to see your child's classroom and learn about what they will be doing this year along with the expectations for their grade level.

Dear Pierre Elliott Trudeau Elementary Families and Community,

During this time of transitioning back into the fall routine, I hope you are excited to be at school and to tackle the new school year. I am generally at Trudeau on Tuesday afternoons and Fridays.

The role of VSB Area Counsellors is to work with students in the areas of personal and emotional development. Counsellors often talk about concerns related to friendships, problem-solving, or understanding and managing emotions. Talking with a counsellor does not mean there is something wrong with your child. We are another supportive adult at school who helps children face challenges and grow more capable and resilient. We may refer to community services if deemed helpful, but we discuss that with parents first.

Area counsellors work together with students, staff, parents/caregivers, and community partners to support students.


