Wednesday, February 22 is Pink Shirt Day

In 2007, Halifax students, David Shepherd, Travis Price and their teenage friends organized a high-school protest to wear pink in sympathy with a Grade 9 boy who was being bullied [for wearing a pink shirt]...[They] took a stand against bullying when they protested against the harassment of a new Grade 9 student by distributing pink T-shirts to all the boys in their school. 'I learned that two people can come up with an idea, run with it, and it can do wonders,' says Mr. Price, 17, who organized the pink protest. 'Finally, someone stood up for another kid. So Mr. Shepherd and some others headed off to a discount store and bought 50 pink tank tops. They sent out a message to schoolmates that night, and the next morning they hauled the shirts to school in a plastic bag. As they stood in the foyer handing out the shirts, the bullied boy walked in. His face spoke volumes. 'It looked like a huge weight was lifted off his shoulders,' Mr. Price recalled. The bullies were never heard from again.

Division Seven, Ms. Taylor's class is celebrating Black History Month. We have been having conversations about treating people fairly and kindly and not focussing on what they look like on the outside but focussing on what they are like in the inside. We talked about Mae Jemison who says, "If you can dream it work hard to achieve it you can do it!" The children talked about their dreams as well then we learned about Jackle Robinson who says great leaders are brave and that you have to be brave to make great changes. We will continue to talk about several people who have influenced the black movement. We will continue to have conversations about the fair treatment of all people regardless of their race their colour or where they originally come from!



Division 3, Ms. Montagon's class started Measurement and learning a variety of games from around the world in Math. Last week they played Gomoku from Japan and week before Yut Nori from Korea. We are practising basic facts and strategy. In Science, we started Motion and Simple Machines. We think we should go to Playland to experience what we learn. In Social Studies, we are learning about Black Excellence. Today we learned about how the Aquatic Centre used to be segregated from 1928-1945 and so non-white Vancouverites claimed the beach at the foot of Burrard Street bridge by the Marina, Vanier Park, as their own and called it "Brown Beach".  \checkmark Parents take picture books for babies and pre-schoolers to a yellow bin in their school designated for donations during a 2 week book drive

 \checkmark Rotary-Arbutus members source and buy extra new books too

 \checkmark With the expert help of Early Learning Teachers at Vancouver School District, Rotary members clean and label your recycled books and sort them for age and appropriateness

 \checkmark Finally, books are given, through School District programs, to children to keep and enjoy
