Remembrance Day Assembly Thursday, November 10, 11:00 am

Please join us this Thursday as we commemorate Remembrance Day. All members of our school community are invited to this moving assembly, and the assembly will be held in the Queen Elizabeth Auditorium. As this is our first Remembrance Day Assembly together in person, we would like to remind everyone of the solemn nature of this assembly. All of our classes will be presenting during the assembly, and while we know you may want to show your appreciation, there will be no applause during the assembly. Student and Family Affordability Fund

This is a reminder of the email that was sent home last week. Thank you to those of you who have already responded; we ask that all families take the time to respond.

The VSB has received one time funds to address the rising costs families are facing. The Ministry of Education and Child Care's mandate is that the funds be used to improve student access to nutritional food, and/or to directly offset costs to families.

The spending plan for Bayview includes 2 broad categories:

- 1. Food and Nutritional Supports
 - a. to support students and families identified as needing assistance
 - b. universal support to all students (for example: nutritious snacks, lunches, nutritional programs)
- 2. Family Assistance/Offsetting Costs to students and families
 - a. to support students and families identified as needing assistance
 - b. universal supports to all students (for example: field trip costs, performances, artist-in-residence)

We have a PAC and staff working group who will be working alongside myself to determine universal supports (item b in both categories). You and your family will benefit from the universal supports as they will be applied to all students.

From these one-time funds, a portion will be allocated in both categories to support families who need/request assistance. I wish to be sensitive to the needs of everybody and am asking families to self-identify as experiencing food or income security concerns. The goal is to make access to these funds confidential, barrier and stigma free. Any families who self-identify will be known only to myself. Please complete the form here <u>affordability fund</u> to indicate whether or not your family would like to access these funds.

On Friday, November 25, all schools in VSB will be engaged in day of learning with an Indigenous Focus. Our staff are continuing their work to respond to the 94 Calls to Action from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission and in particular to call #63 which says, "This TRC call to action asks for the commitment of the Council of Ministers of Education in Canada to maintain a commitment to Aboriginal education issues; from creating and applying the use of K-12 curriculum and learning resources on Aboriginal peoples Canadian history, including the tragic history of residential schools. To developing an intercultural understanding, and identifying appropriate teacher-training needs to address these issues."
