Orange Shirt Day and National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

Each fall we take time to honour the victims of Residential Schools in Canada. We ask students to wear orange as a symbol of the story of young Phyllis Webstad who had her shiny new orange shirt taken away on her first day at St. Joseph Mission. This year, September 30 has been declared a national holiday as a day for all Canadians to learn more about residential schools and to continue on our journey of reconciliation. There will be no school on September 30 so instead, we will have our <u>Orange Shirt Day assembly on September 29.</u> We encourage all students to wear orange as Orange Shirt Day is also an opportunity for Indigenous and Non-Indigenous people, local governments, schools and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come.



Very Important Information Regarding Reporting Student Absences

Student safety is of paramount importance at the Vancouver School District. Ensuring student safety is a shared responsibility. To assist schools, we ask parents to notify schools of student absences. If your child will be absent from school, please phone the school to report this absence as early as possible. Parents should leave a message on a dedicated answering service by calling (604-713-5159). The system will ask you for your school's extension number. Bayview's extension # is 10. You are also welcome to email us at studentrecordsbayview@vsb.bc.ca

Messages will be received before the office is open. School offices are busy places: consistently notifying the school in advance of your child's absence will significantly improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the Safe Arrival Morning Routine.

Student Sign Out Procedure

When you pick up your child during the school day, please ensure that you sign them out at the school office. If you do not sign out your child, they will be unaccounted for, and the school will identify your child as a 'missing' student and will commence a search of school grounds. If the school staff do not locate the child, and are unable to reach a parent promptly, the school will call the Vancouver Police Department. Therefore, clear communication is essential for ensuring the safety of your child and to prevent unnecessary searches.
