Here are some situations where it may be appropriate for families to send their input:

- Need to share specific information about social dynamics (friendships, history of conflict/bullying, etc.);


- Need to share specific information about learning style (student has specific needs, students does not do well in certain learning environments, etc.);

- Need to share specific concerns related to your child;
- Need to share specific circumstances that could impact your child's learning.

Most times, it should not be necessary to make a special request. Your child's current teacher and our extended team know your child well and will have good ideas about who they learn well with. In most cases, Quilchena staff is already aware of the needs listed above and will take them into account during the class placement process. This is also a reminder that, while we consider all requests, we might not be able to fulfill all of them. Please do not write for the following purposes:

- To request a specific teacher - This may eliminate your letter from consideration.

- To request a non-combined class

Are you looking for a rewarding job working in a school setting supporting children and youth with special needs? There is an ongoing need for qualified Educational Assistants in B.C. schools.

- Our VSB EA Diploma Program offers: Relevant instruction in 14 critical courses provided by professionals active in their fields, Relevant instruction in 14 criti over 400 hours of instruction.
 - Pertinent workshop Certificates in CPI (Nonviolent Crisis Intervention) POPARD, First Aid, EASE, and Seizure
 - 2-four week-practicums in VSB schools; over 250 hours of practical learning

Prerequisites include:

- Sufficient vision and hearing to perform job-related duties. Physically capable to lift 35 pounds (about 16 kg); transfer students from wheelchair to
- toilet, chair, recreational equipment or change table; keep up with active students throughout the school day. Minimum: Grade 12 Graduation and transcripts indicating academic capability to support
- students from kindergarten to Grade 12. Preference: 70% minimum in English 12 or equivalent
- Preference: Experience working or volunteering with children/youth with diversities, especially in an educational setting.
