# **School Learning Plan for 2023-24**

In the Spring of 2023, we engaged in a collective brainstorming session with our teachers, SSW support workers, office admin, supervision aides, and administration to identify the specific needs of our students. Consequently, we arrived at a new focus for the upcoming 2023-24 school year, centered around **Social-Emotional Learning (SEL)** and the cultivation of **prosocial behaviors.** 



**Social-Emotional Learning (SEL)** is defined as "the process by which individuals, both young people and adults alike, acquire and apply knowledge, skills, and attitudes necessary for developing healthy identities, managing emotions, achieving personal and collective goals, demonstrating empathy towards others, establishing and maintaining supportive relationships, and making responsible and compassionate decisions" (CASEL).

**Prosocial behaviours** are defined as "a range of positive behaviors including positive interactions (e.g., friendly play or peaceful conflict resolutions), altruism (e.g., showing kindness, sharing, offering help), and behaviors that reduce stereotypes" (Mares and Woodard, 2007).

At Shaughnessy, we recognize the significance of SEL in nurturing and developing emotional intelligence, self-awareness, empathy, and responsible decision making. By integrating SEL into our curriculum, we aim to equip our students with the tools they need to thrive academically, emotionally, and socially.

Collaboration between educators, parents, and students is important. As we embark on this journey, we invite you to join us in embracing this important focus. Together, let us foster an educational experience that not only equips our students with knowledge but also empowers them to navigate life's challenges with resilience and empathy. We are excited to embark on this important journey together.

# **GENERAL \$35.00 SUPPLY FEE**



The Vancouver School Board offers the service of purchasing basic school supplies in bulk at wholesale prices and passing the cost savings on to families. The School Supply Fee for 2023-2024 is \$35.00 per student\*.

This fee covers basic consumable school supplies used for students' personal use such as paper, writing tools, glue sticks, erasers, exercise books and art supplies. Supplies are provided for the full year.

#### SUPPLEMENTARY FEES

#### Student Agenda/Planner - \$10

Students at Shaughnessy will be using an Agenda/Planner in grades (1 to 7). School agendas/planners are a valuable tool for teaching children how to organize and plan for school. While students are not required to have an agenda/planner it is designed to assist students with the skills of organization and time management and is a very useful communication tool often used between teachers and families.

#### Performance Fee

This supplementary fee supports the school in bringing in talented and professional theatrical and musical performers that align with a particular educational theme. As performances are arranged, parents may be asked to contribute.

#### EarthBites Fee - \$45

During the school year, and as permissible under Provincial and District Health and Safety protocols and direction, non-curricular activities may be offered to students with nominal fees. Program fees will be published at that time.

#### Workbooks - \$20

Workbooks may include JumpMath, IXL, and MathUp. These materials supplement the classroom math program.

# Field Studies – To be determined throughout the school year at the classroom level

Throughout the school year your child's teacher may plan supplementary learning opportunities at locations outside of the school and request monies towards entrance fees, transportation or equipment rental. Your child's teacher will communicate this information to you directly.

### FINANCIAL HARDSHIP

As a reminder, the Vancouver School Board will not deny a child access to the school supplies required for his or her educational program because of financial hardship. Nor will any child be excluded from activities where a fee is charged. If at any time there is a financial challenge, please contact the school Principal, (insert name). All requests will be treated confidentially.
