## **Dressing for The Weather**

Although we've enjoyed some beautiful fall weather with many warm, sunny days, the true fall season has now arrived. As temperatures continue to drop, it's important that students come to school dressed in outerwear suitable for the cold, wet, and windy conditions. On the West Coast, rain is just part of daily life, and most days, students will be outside during recess and lunch. Only in cases of extremely poor weather do we declare an "inside day," where students remain indoors and play quietly in our lunchrooms. We try to avoid this when possible, as it's essential for students to get fresh air and stay active before returning to class.

To fully enjoy their time outdoors during recess and lunch, students need to be dressed warmly. Additionally, proper outerwear is crucial in case of emergencies or unexpected building evacuations. Unfortunately, many students are still arriving at school without jackets or wearing shorts and hoodies—even on the coldest, rainiest days. Please ensure your children come dressed appropriately for outdoor activities (e.g., boots and a coat). Since our field gets quite muddy and wet this time of year, packing an extra pair of socks and pants in your child's backpack is also recommended.

# Flu Season Is Coming What can parents do?

- 1. Arrange for your family to have an annual flu shot if your child has a chronic health condition (call the Health Unit for more information).
- 2. Prevent illness by maintaining good health habits...frequent hand washing, eat a variety of foods, exercise and get enough sleep.
- 3. Recognize flu symptoms—stuffy nose, cough, sore chest, fever, chills, muscle and joint pains. Vomiting and diarrhea are not usual symptoms of Influenza but may be seen in young children.
- 4. **Keep your child at home away from others** and treat the symptoms with bed rest, plenty of fluids and acetaminophen (i.e. Tylenol) for fever and aches.
- 5. Call your doctor if your child has a rash, high fever, earache, severe vomiting and/or diarrhea. If the school finds it necessary to send your child home because of illness, please make sure you have made alternate arrangements when you are not available. Inform the school of these arrangements.

## **Kindergarten Registration for 2026-27**

### Kindergarten registration for children born in 2021 begins on November 1

All kindergarten applicants are required to complete an online application for their English catchment elementary school. This includes families who wish to apply for District Choice programs (Early French Immersion, Montessori, Indigenous Focus School, Early Mandarin Bilingual, Nootka Fine Arts) and/or make a cross boundary application to attend a non-catchment school. The priority registration period for kindergarten opens on **November 1** and closes on **January 31**. Students who submit an online application within this priority period will be accommodated <u>before</u> late applicants.

#### Applying for kindergarten is a **2-step process**:

**Step 1:** Online Application (ApplyNow)

 Completion of an online application form (<a href="https://applynow.vsb.bc.ca/">https://applynow.vsb.bc.ca/</a>) for the school year 2026-27

#### **Step 2:** Verification of documentation

- After applying, you will receive instructions on how to schedule your in-person appointment.
- Bring supporting documentation during your scheduled appointment for verification.

#### Supporting documents needed:

- 1. Proof of residence in Vancouver
- 2. Child's birth certificate
- 3. Immigration documentation (if applicable)
- 4. Immunization records
- 5. Court orders/documents (if applicable)



If you want to apply for a District Choice Program or cross boundary, you must **first apply to your English catchment elementary school**. District Choice Programs and cross boundary applications will be accepted in early 2026. For more information, go to: <u>govsb.ca/kchoice</u> and <u>govsb.ca/crossboundary</u>

In the event there are more in-catchment applicants than available space\* at the school, the following process will be used to prioritize enrolment:

## **Kindergarten Applications Received Between November 1 and January 31**

- 1. **In-catchment** kindergarten applicants with siblings in attendance at the school (and who will be attending next year) will be placed first.
- 2. The names of all other in-catchment registrants will be entered into a **random draw** for the remaining kindergarten spaces.
- 3. Students who cannot be accommodated will be placed on a waitlist in the order in which their name was drawn.

4. In the event there are more in-catchment registrants than can be accommodated at their catchment school, students will be placed at another school as close to the catchment as possible until space becomes available.

## Kindergarten Registrations Received AFTER January 31st

In-catchment kindergarten students who apply **after** January 31 will be accommodated if there is space. If there is no space, their names will be added to the bottom of the existing waitlist.

Note: Sibling priority does not apply for registrations received after January 31.

In the event there are more in-catchment registrants than can be accommodated at their catchment school, students will be placed at another school as close to the catchment as possible until space becomes available.
