3. PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE - Mr. Tony Romano

School Enrollment and Organization

- Enrollment is down this year to 240 students in our regular school program - in part due to smaller Kindergarten classes with only 15 students in each class.
- In addition to our regular program we have two district classes:
 - Exsel focuses on social emotional learning
 - Home learners part-time program with two days in class study and home based learning
 - These two classes bring our total enrollment to 265 students

Class Placement & Philosophy

- Students are now in their homeroom classes for the year.
- Placement goal: Create a positive, supportive learning environment while meeting the needs of all students.
- Staff uses professional judgment to make balanced class placements, regardless of parent input.
- Class groupings created in May using these criteria:
 - Class size regulations (Ministry of Education guidelines)
 - Social, emotional, and behavioural balance
 - Range of learning needs (including special education)
 - Physical and social maturity (esp. for combined grades)
 - At least one friend per student
 - Learning styles and strengths

School Updates

- The VSB passed a motion to approve defibrillators being placed in all VSB schools
 - Our defibrillator will be installed outside the office in the main hallway.
 - An Amoxicillin kit (nasal spray) has also been provided and will be kept in the school office.

Sports & Activities

- Cross Country (Grades 3–7): Schedule coming next week.
- Volleyball Club (Grades 5–7): Starting soon.

Choir Registration (Fall Term)

- Rehearsals start Sept 25
 - o Primary: Thursdays at lunch
