- Supporting and enriching the quality of education and wellbeing of students
- Fostering a welcoming, inclusive, and supportive school community
- Volunteer Lead Events, Activities & Roles Form:

9. PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE – Mr. Tony Romano (35 min)

- Mr. Romano: 4th year at Beaconsfield
- School enrollment used for class organization: enrollment is down this year, 225 students in the regular student program.
- We lost Ms. Merani, there were not enough K registrations for a second K class.
- We lost the ExSEL program (excellence in social emotional learning)
- We still have the Home Learner's program, managed on the second floor of the school. In total, we have approximately 255 students with these students
- The last planning meeting was last week to discuss class organization, to implement last minute changes, and to build the best scenarios for the students. Parents can email Mr. Romano to schedule a meeting if they have some concerns regarding their child and the class organization.
- Taken into consideration for class organization (among others): Class size regulation, special needs, physical and social maturity, etc.

- School updates: thanks to the community, we now have new ipads, raised about 40K in the past 2 years for this purchase to replace the previous ipads that were about 7-8 years old.
- Received 60K grant, to update the lunch room, add about 10 spaces, and will also be used for the after school program. As part of this renovation, they will update the sound proofing of the room. Hope to have this done soon as the students are having their lunch elsewhere at the moment
- Choir: students are welcomed to sign up, program starts next week. Primary on Wed, Intermediate: Thurs. After school until the end of Dec.
- Mr. Thomas organized a grade 6-7 soccer team
- Cross country: grade 3-7, will start at the end of the month
- Volleyball: Mr. Paul runs this program, starting soon but to be confirmed. Last year was for grade 5-6-7, TBC this year. Need confirmation from the parent to attend (morning).
- Patty Neibel - tap dance is back, information to be sent out, grades TBC
- Chess club: Ms. Bredin
- Comic's club: at lunch time, TBC.
- ProD day Sept 21.
- Terry Fox Run Sept 25, specific time for each class to be sent by the teachers.
- Open house on Sept. 29
- Sept 30, truth and reconciliation, school not on session
- October 2 photo day

Questions from parents:

- Lunch time to be switched around: discussed with staff, Paul mentioned that the hot lunches are brought around 11AM-11:30AM (the program that is for students in need, not MunchaLunch), so concerns to have this food sitting around for so long. Might be discussed again with the staff. Lunch 12:10 PM to 12:55 PM, eat from 12:10 PM to 12:30PM, then go outside.
- Lunch monitors, is that something that we have? Dory, Roy and Paul are doing this. Is there a need for grade 7 to monitor lunch time? It is done at other schools, part of the leadership program. Last year, there were intermediate students that were recess monitoring outside. Teaching them to be safe outside, will be brought back.
- There are pull out groups for students that have extra learning support. What about pull out groups for students that want to be challenged? This is the teacher that brings the challenge for the students, they need to be approached first.

- Do the grade 1 have buddies? Yes, all the primary students have buddies
- Is the Super Science Club coming back? Paul is working on that with Gladstone Community Coordinator (Scott Deyell). Usually we get either fall or spring, not both. Sportsball, science, and another program may be available. This is a very popular program, run through Science world. Get a free pass in the past when the kid was attending regularly. Based on a lottery allocation.
- Summary of Tony and his experience: started teaching, taught grade 4-5-6-7 in Coquitlam for 25 years, then vice principal for 10 years, then moberly hill elementary and another school close by and then came to Beaconsfield as a principal, close to 35 years of experience in education.
- Confirmation for teacher that will be coming for Ms. Behm maternity leave? Looks like it is someone that has been here before, but not confirmed yet. Expected to leave in October.
- When we pay for school supplies, where does the money go? Bulk order buy, in May the teachers are asked to buy supplies based on Tony's budget. Collecting school fees is a challenge. If a family cannot pay the fees, no obligation.
 - Is there a way to support other families to pay the fees on their behalf? There is a wish list, some teachers were short on specific items, through the PAC these were supplied to the classes.
 - There is an option to make a donation on School Cash Online, above \$20 there is a tax receipt.
 - Need to make this more known that a donation is possible. (either through the school communication or through the PAC). Sometimes it is posted in the class chats what is needed.
- MunchaLunch: it was discussed last year, how to pay for lunch for another kid. Added an option in MunchaLunch to gift a meal, this would be an option to provide food or fund for other kids. If enough funds are raised, could organize a free soup and bun lunch for everyone.
- Structure of classes, is there a philosophy in the school? They want the kids to have different experiences, to be ready for high school and life in general, so they try to have them experience more classrooms and teachers. But some children benefit from staying in the same classroom and teacher. Some requests from parents and the child's needs are considered. Friendship and difficult situations are also considered, but not only this, teachers are weighing in as well.
- Are the (WhatsApp) Class Chats current? It is ongoing, Jesse available to help. Might need a leader for each class chat, make the liaison with the teacher, or organize gifts.
