- Indigenous-Focused Graduation Requirement



FRIM Dual Diploma

French Immersion/Francophone Dual Dogwood

French Immersion students can earn both a British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma) and a Diplôme de fin d'études secondaires en Colombie-Britannique.

To graduate with both diplomas, French Immersion students must meet the graduation requirements for the Dogwood Diploma and, of these 80 credits, they must earn:

- At least 16 credits at the Grade 12 level (including a Français langue seconde- immersion course at the Grade 12 level).
- Français langue seconde-immersion 10 (4 credits).
- A Français langue seconde-immersion course at the Grade 11 level (4 credits) or IB French A2 (SL) 11.
- Français langue seconde-immersion 12 (4 credits).
- At least 12 credits in Grade 10, 11, or 12 courses that are in French with at least 4 of these credits at the Grade 11 or 12 level.

In addition, French Immersion students must also complete four Provincial Graduation Assessments:

- Grade 10 Graduation Numeracy Assessment (English or French)
- Grade 10 Graduation Literacy Assessment
- Grade 12 Graduation Literacy Assessment
- Évaluation de littératie – Français langue seconde-immersion 12

Francophone students can earn both a British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma) and a Diplôme de fin d'études secondaires en Colombie-Britannique.

FYI, Diplôme d'Études en Langue Française ([DELF](#)) is different!

Graduation Program: British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma) English <p>In order to meet graduation requirements and be awarded a British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma), students must earn a minimum of 80 credits and write provincial assessments of numeracy and literacy. The 80 credits include 52 credits for required courses (including 8 credits of Career Education courses and at least 4 credits of Indigenous-focused coursework) and a minimum of 28 elective credits. The 28 elective credits may be from Ministry-Authorized or Board/Authority Authorized (BAA) courses, post-secondary courses or external credentials, but not Locally Developed courses. Students must also complete a minimum of 16 credits at the Grade 12 level, including a required Language Arts 12 course and Career Life Connections.</p>



VSBC WORK EXPERIENCE (WEX) PROGRAM @ SIR WINSTON CHURCHILL SECONDARY

what is it?

- two-year (Grade 11 & 12), 4-credit elective
- 100% off-timetable elective that won't interfere with your course selection or schedule
- consists of TWO components:
 - short assignments to prepare you for the world of work
 - 90 hours of volunteer/paid work experience (~2.5 weeks full time)

why take it?

- real life, hands-on experience that will give you an edge when applying to jobs & post-secondary institutions
- networking, mentorship, and REFERENCES (for employment, post-secondary applications & SCHOLARSHIPS)
- builds confidence, skills, & gives you insight into the working world
- can lead to paid employment

other perks:

- four Grade 12 credits towards graduation
- looking for work/volunteer opportunities? already working? have a volunteer gig lined up for the summer? involved in cadets/scouts?
 - get access to fresh opportunities through the WEX Team

MINIMUM COURSE REQUIREMENTS

INTERNAL SCHOLARSHIPS

- CHURCHILL "MAJOR" AWARDS = SIX CORE ACADEMIC COURSES
- DISTRICT AUTHORITY AWARDS = FIVE CORE ACADEMIC COURSES

EXTERNAL SCHOLARSHIPS

- DEPENDS ON THE SCHOLARSHIP, BUT GENERALLY NO SUCH REQUIREMENT



- MATH, SCIENCES, LANGUAGES, SOCIAL STUDIES, FINE ARTS (MUSIC, ART, FILM, DRAMA), ENGLISH, HOME EC/BUSINESS ED, PHE, TECH STUDIES
- TAKEN AT CHURCHILL DURING GR.12 YEAR

AGAIN, THESE COURSES MUST BE TAKEN AT CHURCHILL DURING YOUR GRAD YEAR (NOT SUMMER/NOT ONLINE).

 - Graduation is top priority


