Please be aware that The City of Vancouver has made STOP sign changes at the intersection of SLOCAN and East 3rd. There are also sign changes made on East 2nd, Slocan and East 3rd (stopping, parking and 3 minute parking). STUDENT LEARNING SURVEY 2024/25

Students in Grades 4 and 7 will be participating in the Student Learning Survey during the month of April. Families are also asked to complete the survey as it provides important information to assess the effectiveness of educational programs, to improve educational program delivery, and to report on student performance and achievements toward system goals such as Human and Social Development and Career Development.

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective. The Student Learning Survey will be administered to students in grades 4 and 7 their parents/guardians/caregivers, and all school staff. We encourage parents/guardians/caregivers to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the Province, in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included. The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at Please click on this link to complete the survey before May 2nd: Student Learning Survey for Parents/Guardians (https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/student-learning-survey.). Any computer or mobile device with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the esurvey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link and by clicking on Take the Survey. On the login page, click on the Parents icon, and then select the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the Results section. The e-survey site will be open until May 2, 2025.
