#### **GROWTH MINDSET:**

We have been working on developing a "growth mindset" for our learning and for our self-growth:

A growth mindset is believing that your brain can grow, and you can learn many new things. You are not born smart; you become smart. The brain is like a muscle, when you exercise your brain, or keep trying, it will get bigger and stronger. A growth mindset is a "can do" attitude and sees challenges as an opportunity to learn and grow. Children with a growth mindset say, "I may not be able to do it, yet" "This is hard, but I will try," and "I can learn how to do this!". Please try some of the growth mindset language at home.

#### **ARE YOU USING YOUR WITS?**

We are also helping students with a strategy to help solve problems that they may have with other students: using their W.I.T.S. When faced with a problem such as: teasing, unfair play, name-calling, or mean behaviour, you can use your WITS to:

W-walk away, I-ignore, T- talk it out, S-seek adult help
