PAC Update

Thanks to the parents who attended the last PAC meeting. We are pleased to share the latest updates from the Parent Advisory Council (PAC) following our November meeting:



1. Classroom Technology: Additional iPads Approved

The PAC has approved funding for an additional set of iPads to support digital learning. This investment will enhance access to technology across classrooms and assist teachers in delivering enriched instructional activities.

2. Teacher Wish List Review

Teachers submitted their annual Needs and Wants Wish List for the school year. Classroom funds have been approved. Other requested items will be reconsidered as the PAC reviews its budget throughout the year. We appreciate the thoughtful efforts of our teaching staff in identifying resources that directly benefit students.

3. Progress continues toward launching a Hot Lunch program:

Fresh Slice Pizza has been selected as the vendor. Planning for licensing, scheduling, and operational requirements is underway. Further information regarding the program's start date will be shared with families soon.

4. Treasurer Transition

A transition of responsibilities from the previous Treasurer is currently in progress. This ensures a smooth handover of financial duties and continued transparency in PAC financial management.

We thank all families, staff, and volunteers for their ongoing support and engagement in strengthening our school community.

Everyone is welcome and encouraged to attend PAC meetings to support school programs, special events and build community. **Our next meeting will be on January 21st at 3:30pm in the library. Babysitting will be available.**

Kindergarten registration for children born in 2021

All kindergarten applicants are required to complete an online application for their English catchment elementary school. This includes families who wish to apply for District Choice programs (Early French Immersion, Montessori, Indigenous Focus School, Early Mandarin Bilingual, Nootka Fine Arts) and/or make a cross-boundary application to attend a non-catchment school.

The priority registration period for kindergarten opens on **November 1** and closes on **January 31**. Students who submit an online application within this priority period will be accommodated before late applicants.

Applying for kindergarten is a **2-step process**:

Step 1: Online Application (ApplyNow)

- Completion of an online application form (<https://applynow.vsb.bc.ca/>) for 2026-27

Step 2: Verification of documentation

- After applying, you will receive instructions on how to schedule your in-person appointment.
- Bring supporting documentation during your scheduled appointment for verification.

Supporting documents needed:

1. Proof of residence in Vancouver
2. Child's birth certificate
3. Immigration documentation (if applicable)
4. Immunization records
5. Court orders/documents (if applicable)



If you want to apply for a District Choice Program or cross boundary, you must **first apply to your English catchment elementary school**. District Choice Programs and cross boundary applications will be accepted in early 2026. For more information, go to: govsb.ca/kchoice and govsb.ca/crossboundary

In the event there are more in-catchment applicants than available space* at the school, the following process will be used to prioritize enrolment:

Kindergarten Applications Received Between November 1 and January 31

1. **In-catchment** kindergarten applicants with siblings in attendance at the school (and who will be attending next year) will be placed first.
2. The names of all other in-catchment registrants will be entered into a **random draw** for the remaining kindergarten spaces.
3. Students who cannot be accommodated will be placed on a waitlist in the order in which their name was drawn.
4. In the event there are more in-catchment registrants than can be accommodated at their catchment school, students will be placed at another school as close to the catchment as possible until space becomes available.

Kindergarten Registrations Received AFTER January 31st

In-catchment kindergarten students who apply **after** January 31 will be accommodated if there is space. If there is no space, their names will be added to the bottom of the existing waitlist.

Note: Sibling priority **does not** apply for registrations received after January 31.

In the event there are more in-catchment registrants than can be accommodated at their catchment school, students will be placed at another school as close to the catchment as possible until space becomes available.

Trudeau Mandarin Bilingual Program (Grade 4 - 7)



The Mandarin Bilingual Program at Pierre Elliott Trudeau Elementary is offered to students from Grade 4 to Grade 7 and is a full day, 9:00am to 3:00pm program. The core curriculum for this program is taught in English. Mandarin is taught through Mandarin Language Arts. The program will develop Mandarin oral communication skills along with reading and writing skills using Chinese characters.

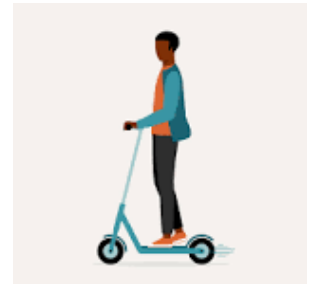

Student Learning Survey – Parent Version

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey/access.htm. Any computer with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link by selecting the school district and school name where your child attends school. The e-survey site will be open until May 1st.



Choose from a wide variety of sport, fitness, arts, education, and social activities for all ages and skill levels. You can join a class, register for a program, or just drop in to a facility near you. Swimming and ice skating are popular with kids.
