School Active Travel - City of Vancouver

- Presentation on the School Active Travel program
- Available funds to improve walking, cycling, and active travel infrastructure around schools
- Goal to encourage families to do more active travel to school
- Virtual walk through conducted to identify areas needing improvement
 - 3rd and Slocan intersection high problem area, had near misses. Coming to school on 3rd, you have to watch for cars to cross Slocan. Prefer 4-way stop (??)
 - 3rd avenue, Slocan to Penticton. Road in poor condition, difficult/dangerous to ride bike on. Speed bump markings need to be repainted. Water pooling, hazard of parents turning around in the teacher parking lot.
 - 2nd Avenue and Slocan. The stop sign on 2nd heading eastbound is set really far back, making it hard to see cars before crossing
 - o 3rd Avenue, Slocan to Renfrew. No curb let downs at intersections.
 - Slocan from 5th to 3rd. Cars come out of alleyways and have to nose out onto the road to look for cars. Dangerous for cyclists picking up speed down the hill. Recommend one way alleys or moving back no parking sign near alleys
 - Kaslo, Kamloops, Nootka. There are areas without sidewalks on either side, typically from 8th Avenue to 4th. For those on the east side of Renfrew, there isn't an option to walk/roll to school on a residential road without walking on the road.
 - Access to Van Tech Slocan and Broadway. No curb letdown to cross Broadway. The call buttons are right adjacent to Broadway - dangerous. Have to step in huge puddle to reach them. Suggest moving back. City suggested changing timing.

- Access to Van Tech Pentiction and Broadway- same concern as Slocan regarding pedestrian call button
- City will send out survey
- An improvement plan will be prepared and shared with PAC

Walk, Bike, Roll Mini Grant - Sandra

- Deadline was October 17, consider applying next year
- Grant is \$1500 to encourage active travel to school
- Could use grant to add more bike racks
